Working with the Dunlap Broadside

Lesson Focus - General introduction to the Declaration of Independence (30 minutes) - grades 5-8

Outcome(s) - Introduce students to the purpose, meaning, and language of the Declaration of Independence.

- 1. <u>Introductions</u> explain who you are, how you can help, the purpose of being a depository librarian, and the expectations for the next half-hour. Go over rules for small groups. (5 min)
- 2. Facts about the library and the *Declaration*. (3-5 min)
- 3. Discuss with entire class the Dunlap Broadside bring up in front of the class (10 min)
 - Who wrote this document?
 - To whom is the document addressed?
 - What do the creators of this document want?
 - Ask about the language used? Is it difficult to read & understand?
- 4. Activity (15 min)
 - Break into small groups
 - Each group will discuss one section of the document (based upon topic in center of table/or flashed on the screen)
 - They will elect one person to report back to large group and one person to write down what are key points of discussion
 - Come back to large group and each group will report back.
- 5. Conclusion Q & A (5 minutes)
