USEFUL INFORMATION.

Following is a partial list of the railroads in the United States. In abbreviating, use the initial letters, except St. for Saint; Ste. for Sainte; Ft. for Fort; S. W., W., etc., for Southwestern, Northwestern, etc., R. R. for Railroad; Ry, for Railway; Co. for Company; usual abbreviation for states when occurring at end of names, as in example (1) following, and spell "of." (1) St. L. S. W. Ry, Co. of Tex., for St. Louis Southwestern Kailway Company of Texas; (2) M. and St. L. R. for Minneapolis and St. Louis Railroad. GPO Produces U.S. Code With New Digital Publishing Technology

The U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) has taken a major step forward in the modernization of its publishing systems by beginning to publish the 2018 main edition of the United States Code through XPub, the agency's new digital technology for XML-based publishing. With the implementation of XPub, GPO will be able to simultaneously publish all legislative documents in a variety of print and digital formats in a timelier manner. The 2018 main edition of the U.S. Code is the first, large-scale production job that GPO has published using the new composition system.



"XPub is reinventing GPO's production process," said GPO Acting Deputy Director John Crawford. "The new system will allow GPO to complete work for Congress and the American people with remarkable efficiency and accuracy. I congratulate everyone who is working to develop this system that will carry GPO into the future."



GPO DIGITIZES PUBLIC PAPERS OF THE PRESIDENTS

Hoover, Truman - George H.W. Bush Added to the Collection

The U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) and the National Archives' Office of the Federal Register (OFR) have digitized volumes of The Public Papers of the Presidents for Presidents Herbert Hoover (1929) through George H.W. Bush (1990), with the exception of the Franklin D. Roosevelt presidency. The papers of President Franklin Roosevelt were published privately before the commencement of the official Public Papers series. Each volume of The Public Papers of the Presidents is comprised of a forward by the President, public writings, addresses, remarks, and photographs. This digitization effort joined the already digital version of Public Papers for Presidents George H. W. Bush (1991-1992), William J. Clinton, George W. Bush, and Barack H. Obama.

"GPO is proud to have digitized these Public Papers of the Presidents," said GPO Acting Deputy Director John Crawford. "Each volume chronicles an important time in our Nation's history. The public will now be able to access these documents on smartphones, tablet, laptops, and personal computers. I congratulate the GPO and OFR employees who made this immense digitization effort come to fruition."








Development Release Cycle

- Four planned quarterly releases each fiscal year comprised of six two-week sprints followed by deployments to Production and COOP instances.
- Program roles including Program Manager, Release Manager, Risk Manager, Product Owners, and Testers are performed by GPO personnel in the office of Programs, Strategy, and Technology and rest of the govinfo team is made up of contracted development, support, and system administration staff.
- Onsite contracted development, support, and system administration teams use Agile Scrum, Kanban, and DevOpsSec methodologies on **govinfo**.




