




Ability to browse Digitization Registry by project looking for collaborator and highlight collaborator N&Os in navigation

GPO Action


- Enhanced search capability enabled for the Digitization Registry
 - Currently available using "Advanced Search" feature








DLC Draft Recommendation






DLC Draft Recommendation

- Future planned capabilities contingent on Funding for FY11







DLC Draft Recommendation

 Consult Council when major features of functionalities announced for future releases of FDsys are deferred. Council pledged to respond within two weeks with comments




 GPO provided the proposed remaining feature sets to DLC for comment in July 2010






- As PMO reviews system requirements and functionality for future releases of FDsys, stakeholders including the FDLP community should be included








FDLP Benefits for Libraries & the Public


- Two-Phased Project Approach

 - Phase II: Work with Council and the FDLP community to brainstorm and implement new services for FDLP libraries.






Phase I Progress Update


- GPO has submitted a draft of the "Top 10" list and the more expansive document to Council for review.

Top 10 Benefits Afforded to all FDLP Libraries


- Free Federal information products in a variety of formats to supplement existing library material and to provide access to unique material
- Free cataloging records from the national authority on U.S. Federal publications
- Free, permanent public access to online content from GPO partners often fee-based or restricted
- Educational opportunities training the next generation of Government information specialists
- Collection development opportunities important in an era of declining budgets






Top 10 Benefits Afforded to all FDLP Libraries

- Consulting and networking opportunities from GPO and with fellow Government information experts
- Free FDLP marketing and promotional material
- Opportunity to participate in pilot projects with GPO to test new processes and technologies
- Ensuring that dedicated Government information professionals remain on staff – critical in this time of hybrid collections where it is necessary to build and maintain collections of local interest and navigate the broad range of informational resources
- Enhancement of the status/prestige of an institution designated as an FDLP member
