
TYING DISPLAYS TO CURRENT EVENTS

SPARKING INTEREST



The display included updates from the impeachment proceedings, including the articles of impeachment, President Trump's response to Speaker Pelosi, the daily Congressional Record, and the roll call of votes on each count.
