National Collection Service Area Framework

National Collection Service Areas (NCSA)

- Group FDLs into four regions as a means of:
 - Ensuring geographically dispersed permanent public access to Federal Government information products.
 - Sharing resources among depository libraries.
 - Receiving services from LSCM.
- 2015: The JCP specified there be no fewer than four geographically dispersed tangible copies of a publication in the FDLP.

NCSAs

GPO used a modified Census region map to create four NCSAs: Northeast, South, Midwest, and West.





Goals

- Improve opportunities for regional collecting and weeding flexibilities.
- Ensure adequate tangible copies for access.
- Localized services to depository libraries and NCSAs.
- Foster collaboration among depository libraries in service areas.



Overall Impacts

Libraries

- Potential for more targeted collection of Federal information to meet local needs.
- Redefining "local" for Federal information collections.
- Reduces need for "just-in-case" collecting.
- Ability to right-size collection.
- Allows for regional weeding flexibilities.

LSCM

- More responsibility for managing overall National Collection throughout the country.
- Addressing concerns of safety net (public access guarantee).
- Localized service to NCSAs and depositories.
- Monitoring collection levels to ensure adequate copies.





- Potential for resource sharing to ease the burden of space planning as microfiche is phased out.
- LSCM recruiting Preservation Stewards and Print Selectors to ensure permanent public access.

- Shared reference / ILL to improve access.
- Preservation opportunities.

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Microfiche Phase Out

- December 2021: libraries were <u>alerted</u> to the phase out of microfiche distribution in the FDLP.
 - Selective depository libraries encouraged to review their item selection profile to identify microfiche that they are currently receiving. Microfiche selectors have an opportunity to select the paper equivalent of microfiche titles.
 - Selectives currently relying on another library's microfiche selection may want to consider profiling for the paper format themselves if they feel they need a tangible copy locally.



Microfiche Phase Out

- A <u>list of microfiche titles</u> and their alternate formats is available.
- The deadline for getting selections into DSIMS is April 22, 2022, midnight (EDT).
- Libraries that meet this deadline will have their selections activated by Monday, April 25, 2022.
- Libraries that miss the April 22 deadline can still add paper format item numbers to their DSIMS selection cart; however, they will not be activated until October 1.

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Biennial Survey of Depository Libraries

- Means by which depository libraries report their conditions to GPO; it is administered every two years, and response is required by law.
- The 2021 Biennial Survey was released in January 2022 and was open through March 2022.
- Currently, LSCM staff are following up with libraries and will release preliminary survey results and analysis within the next several months.

LSCM Pilot Projects

- Opportunity to provide services to Federal depository libraries in areas of cataloging, condition assessment, preservation, digitization, and other areas.
- Opportunity to explore new or alternative ways of providing traditional library services or processes.
- Outcomes of pilot projects enrich and enhance collections and services in support of the National Collection.



Pilot Project Opportunity 1

- Cataloging, item-level inventory, condition assessment, and digitization of between 200-300 monographs from the U.S. Department of War (formed 1789; dissolved 1947) Superintendent of Documents call number stem **W** or other war-era temporary agencies.
 - The scope of the documents should be either the U.S. war years of WWI (1914-1918) or WWII (1941-1945).
- Open for submissions: September 1 October 15, 2021
- Utah State University, Merrill-Cazier Library selected

Pilot Project 1

Worked with staff at Utah State University to:

- Inventory pilot collection
- Assess condition
- Collect surrogates



Pilot Project 1

- Temporary Executive Agency Civil Defense materials.
- Approximately 250 bound volumes/ 1,000 titles.
- Overall good condition.
- LSCM will pay for USU to ship to GPO for digitization.
- GPO will provide preservation plan and supplies to USU.



Pilot Project Opportunity 2

- Cataloging, item-level inventory, condition assessment, and digitization of a collection of 200-300 Federal Government print publications focused on a state, region, common theme, or topic, and preferably those without records in the <u>Catalog of U.S. Government Publications</u>.
 - Suggested collections may include, but are not limited to:
 - Publications issued by regional Federal offices or agencies.
 - Publications in the areas of voting, civil rights, women's suffrage, or tribal rights.
 - Publications on environmental or geographic region-based topics, such as waterways, land rights, energy sources, or establishment of national parks.

govinfo CoreTrustSeal Certification

• Background

- The Core Trustworthy Data Repository Requirements were developed by the DSA–WDS Partnership Working Group on Repository Audit and Certification, a Working Group (WG) of the Research Data Alliance.
- Establishes 16 common requirements for certification of repositories drawn from:
 - Data Seal of Approval (DSA: <u>www.datasealofapproval.org</u>)
 - ICSU World Data System (ICSU-WDS: https://www.icsuwds.org/services/certification)

govinfo CoreTrustSeal Certification

- CoreTrustSeal Process
 - CoreTrustSeal is a more accessible process of assessment than ISO 16363.
 - Includes peer-review as part of assessment; 111 institutions worldwide are CTR-certified.
 - Does not include a site visit, application documentation is made publicly available.
 - Only 1,000 euros for application.
 - Certification lasts three years.

govinfo CoreTrustSeal Certification

- CoreTrustSeal supports ISO 16363 certification
 - Risk Mitigation if ISO 16363 ever becomes unavailable or unviable.
 - A broader network of peer repositories and engagement with a certification-standards community (111+ repositories, 9 Federal).
 - Potential opportunity for volunteer participation in peer reviews and contribution to CTS requirements.
 - Increased opportunities to share experience in multiple certification processes nationally and internationally.
 - Highly accessible repurposing documentation from ISO audits makes preparation seamless, cost is very low.
 - Potential to reach a broader community within the data sciences.
 - Requirement to make documentation public may increase public trust and recognition for transparency efforts.

govinfo CoreTrustSeal Certification

- Next Steps
 - GPO submits application to CoreTrustSeal.
 - If accepted, GPO expects to maintain both forms of certification on regular certification schedules.
 - GPO aspires to serve as an example for other institutions who are considering ISO 16363 certification as a means of "extended" certification after achieving "core" certification through CoreTrustSeal.
