Collection Development Policies

The following are ways to identify and document the Federal government information needs of the congressional district or local area:

- Analyze demographic and socio-economic data about the community served
- Gain knowledge from subject matter expertise of library colleagues
- Review reference questions
- Track depository resources used in answering questions
- Review daily news sources
- Review other library Web pages or guides
- Employ library user surveys that include questions about Federal government information needs.
- Gain knowledge from participation in library associations or other library networks
- Review data about patron collection use within the library building (e.g., in-house use or circulation)
- Review use of PURLs from your catalog and library Web pages

User Needs

- Item selection profiles should be updated regularly to ensure that user needs are being met
- The needs of both primary and non-primary users must be considered
- Collection Development policies and plans are recommended

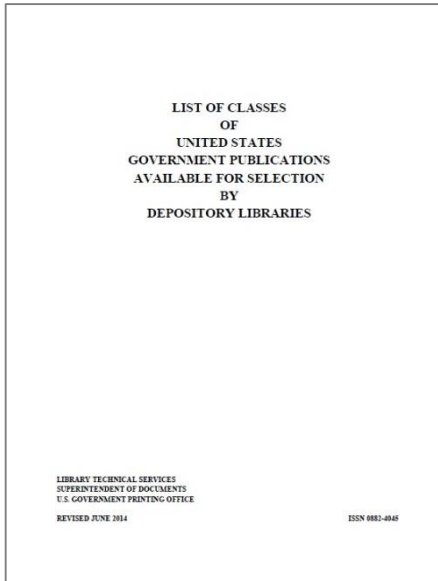

Depository Selection Information Management System (DSIMS)

- Used to view and manage selection profile
- Log in with library number and FDLP password
- Dropped item numbers take effect immediately
- Added item numbers for online materials take effect immediately
- Added item numbers for tangible materials take effect at the beginning of the Federal fiscal year (October 1)

What formats to select?

Benefits of keeping and/or selecting tangible:

- Some publications are preferred by users in paper format.
- Paper may offer more security for preservation and access.
- A core collection, with historical or current materials in tangible formats, may benefit the needs of many users.
- Some content is not online.
- Online access features may not be user-friendly.
- Some online resources are not official like their print counterpart.
- Some agency websites only provide access to the current issue of online resources.

What formats to select?

Why libraries might select online only (EL) item numbers:

- Receive cataloging records for EL items when purchased from vendor
- Use of various collection tools is easier
- Sometimes agencies decide to switch formats

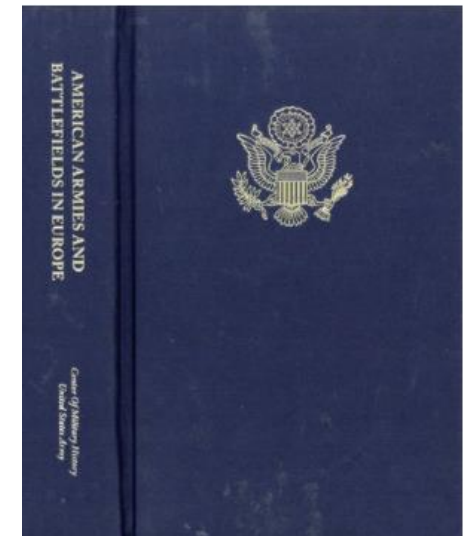
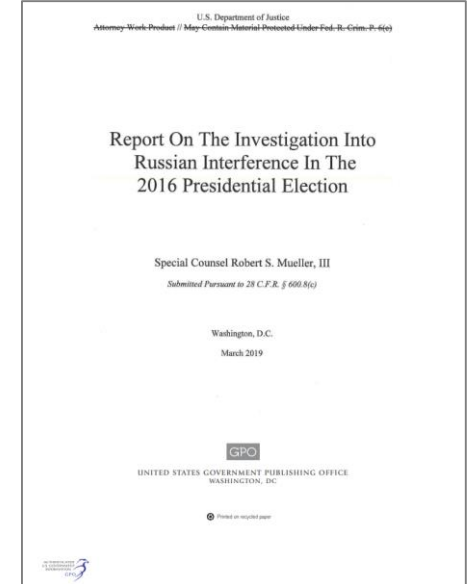
Selection Requirements

- Regional depositories either select everything in the List of Classes or have signed, official agreements with selectives who can select and receive the regional copy.
- Selectives can choose not to select any item numbers at all.



Special Selection Offers (SSO)

- Outside the regular item selection process
- GPO identifies titles of interest that are being published in print
- GPO opens a Special Selection Offer via FDLP News & Events
 - Libraries who don't select the item number (so they normally wouldn't get the publication) can fill out a form and say they'd like to receive this particular title
 - First-come, first-served
- The SSO becomes a part of your depository collection and is subject to regular weeding rules



Online Publications and Digital Depositories

Digital Depository Libraries

The digital depository can be an excellent model for the FDLP library with limited budgets, space, and staff to process, house, and maintain tangible depository materials.

GPO always recommends cataloging online resources and/or providing subject guides or other finding aids to help patrons be aware of the online resources.

Digital Depository Libraries

1. New libraries who join the FDLP as a digital depository
2. Existing FDLP libraries who change their selection profile to stop receiving anything tangible and also weed their tangible collection over time to nothing
3. Existing FDLP libraries who change their selection profile to stop receiving anything tangible but keep some tangible material in the collection

CATALOG OF U.S. GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS (CGP)

New Titles

The New Titles page is an easy way to find all the latest documents added to the *Catalog of U.S. Government Publications (CGP)*. It provides access to new documents in many different formats, such as print documents, electronic documents, or eBooks. It also provides information on documents that are still in-process. Users can look for documents in a particular range of time by clicking on specific timeframes, such as Last Seven Days or Last Three Months.

New Electronic Titles (NET) Monthly Archive Reports

New Electronic Titles (NET) Monthly Archive Reports are generated from data collected from the *Catalog of U.S. Government Publications (CGP)*. Monthly NET Reports are made available by the middle of the following month (e.g. January's monthly NET report will be available by mid-February).

Beginning in April 2005, data from the CGP was used to generate monthly NET reports that included new records and records that had been recently updated. In the September 2006 NET report, the methodology to generate these reports changed to include only new records. Development to refine the NET report format is ongoing.

The current NET reports will be made available in HTML format with links in the titles to the bibliographic records and in Comma Separated Value (CSV) format, which is compatible with most spreadsheet software. In partnership with the Government Printing Office, The University of Iowa Libraries has collected U.S. federal government information since 1884. This includes nearly 1500 posters promoting services, programs, and initiatives by agencies such as the Works Progress Administration, the War Mobilization Office, and the Environmental Protection Agency. Although the bulk of the UI collection spans the 1970s through the 1990s, it also includes items from pre-WWII through the present. These posters provide a graphic representation of priorities of a given presidential administration and of the culture at a discrete point in time.



CIC Floppy Disk Project

The CIC Floppy Disk Project is a partnership between the [U.S. Government Printing Office](#) and the [Indiana University, Bloomington Libraries](#) on behalf of the [Committee on Institutional Cooperation \(CIC\)](#), making publications that were distributed to federal depository libraries on floppy disk available via FTP over the Internet. The site is designed to provide a central location through which Federal Data, made available on floppy diskettes, can be identified, located and downloaded. While the project provides the information as it was originally presented on the floppy disks, it cannot provide software which might be needed to fully operate the disk. Records provided within the FDP inform the user about the specifications and may refer users to "read me" files. Consultation with local computer administrators may be required. With the ever-increasing number of products being released by the Government Printing Office, **FDP** enables libraries to either fill in gaps to their collections, or provide an immediate access point for patrons. While the collection represents over 200 entries, our collection is not complete. We would welcome contributions from your library's holdings or suggested titles.

A search will retrieve a title list from which individual titles can be "clicked" and down-loaded (click on the file name next to "link.")

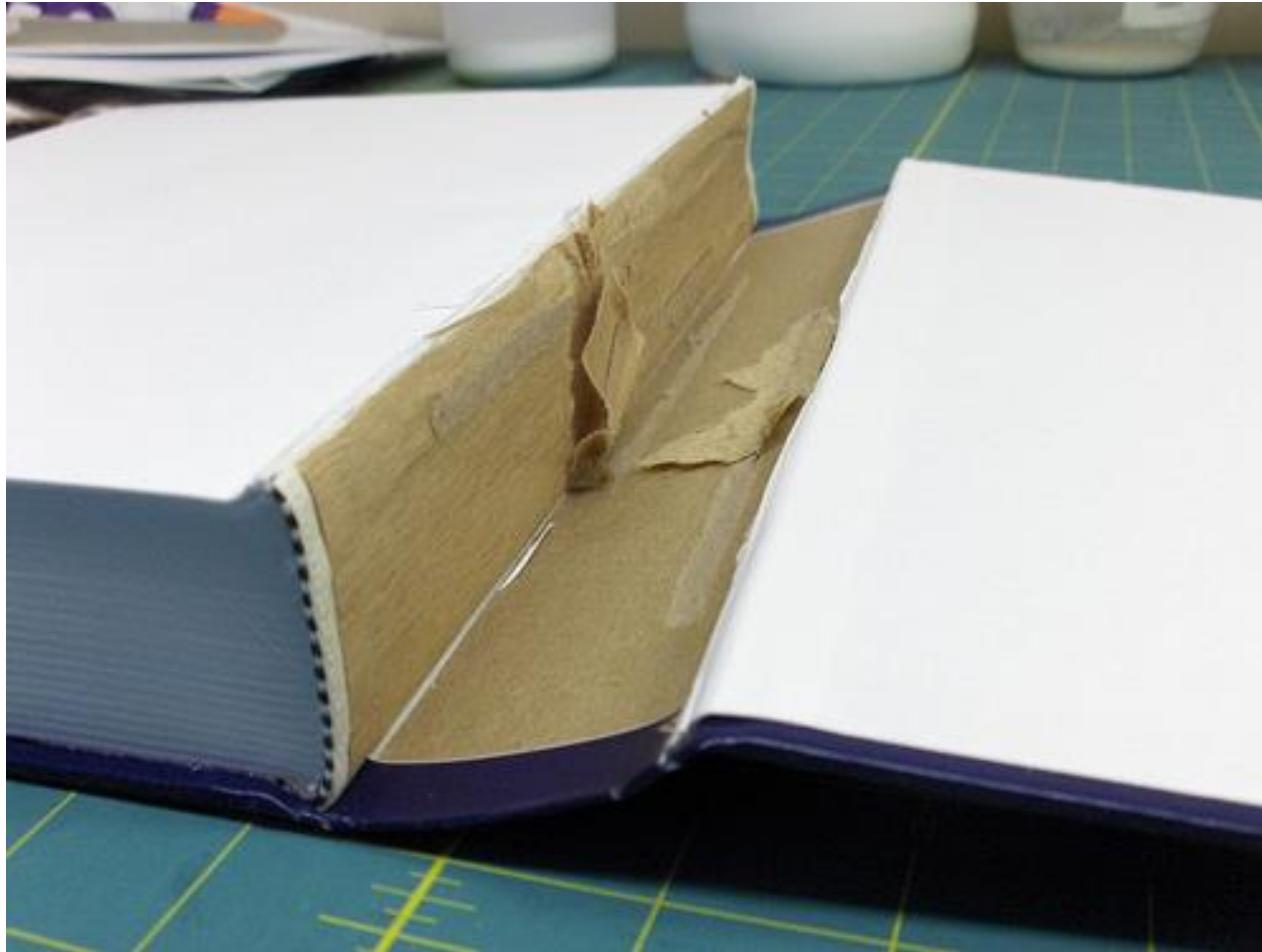
1. When clicking on the file link, you will be prompted to open or save the file.
2. Select **SAVE** and an appropriate location (e.g. floppy disk or hard drive). All files are compressed.
3. Once the file is downloaded, double click on it to "explode" the compressed files and directories (the files will be extracted within the directory where the compressed file resides).

Every effort has been made to maintain the original file/directory structure of the diskettes. Please let us know if you have any [problems or suggestions](#).

- Understand your institution's needs
- Stay engaged and creative
- Set up the PURL reports for your library
- Treat and house your publications with care
