- Customizable with themes and widgets, but don't have as much freedom to customize as you can with self hosted because of the plugins you can add.

Self-hosted

WordPress.org <http://wordpress.org/>

- Wordpress Audio Player <http://wordpress.org/extend/plugins/audio-player/> Allows for easy uploads of MP3 files to WordPress Blog
- PodPress <http://www.manvswebapp.com/podpress> More useful if you are doing a full on podcast, but will allow for easy integration into iTunes
- Q&A <http://premium.wpmudev.org/project/qa-wordpress-questions-and-answers-plugin> Allows for a “yahoo answers” type system to be easily added into your site
- SlideShare <http://yoast.com/wordpress/slideshare/> Easy embedding of slideshare decks (think YouTube but for powerpoint) into page
- Anthologize <http://anthologize.org/> Turns wordpress blog/website into an eBook that can be read on eReaders
