



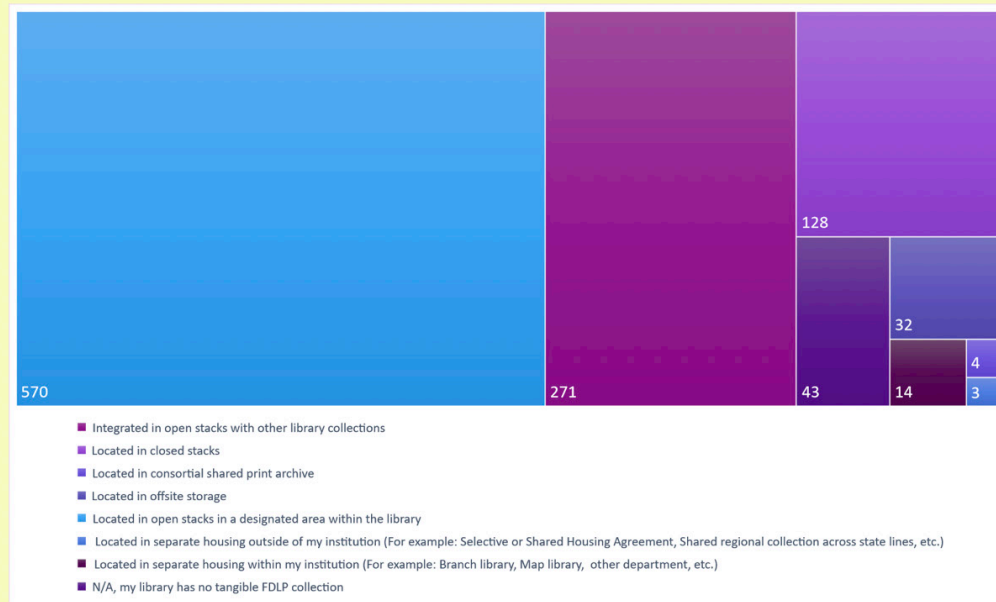
# 2021 Biennial Survey of Depository Libraries

## Introduction and Methods

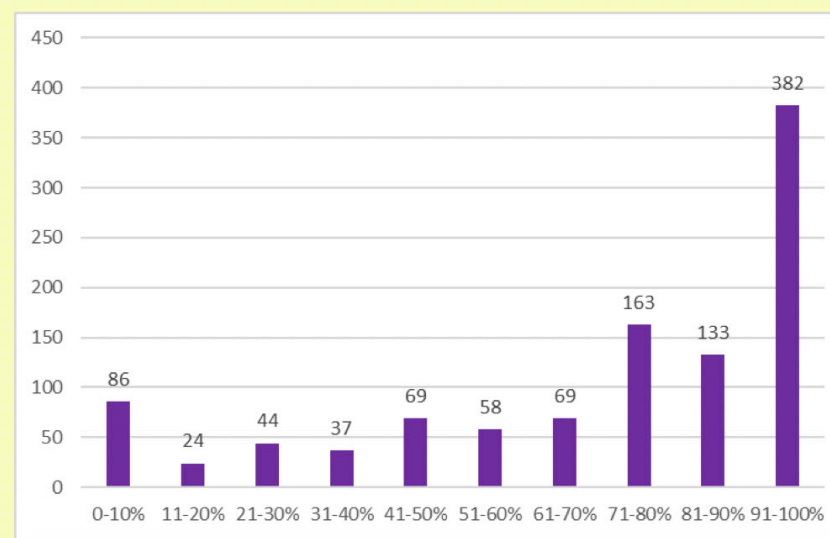
- Every two years, GPO conducts the Biennial Survey of Depository Libraries, and examines the results to evaluate trends and current issues. The Biennial Survey also fulfills 44 U.S. Code §1909's requirements for the Superintendent of Documents to report on conditions at depository libraries.
- The questions and full dataset of responses for the 2021 Biennial Survey of Depository Libraries are available at the bottom of this page on the FDL.gov File Repository.
- The questions for the 2021 Biennial Survey of Depository Libraries were developed by LSCM staff in collaboration with the Depository Library Council (DLC), the advisory group to the Director of GPO, and the Superintendent of Documents. The survey was open from January 26, 2022 – March 23, 2022.
- The survey was sent to 1,113 libraries and the report dataset contains 1,065 responses, for a 96% return rate.

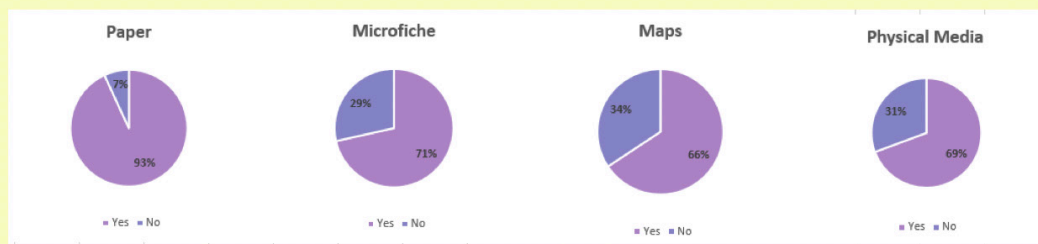
## TANGIBLE COLLECTIONS

Q16a – My tangible FDL collection is primarily...

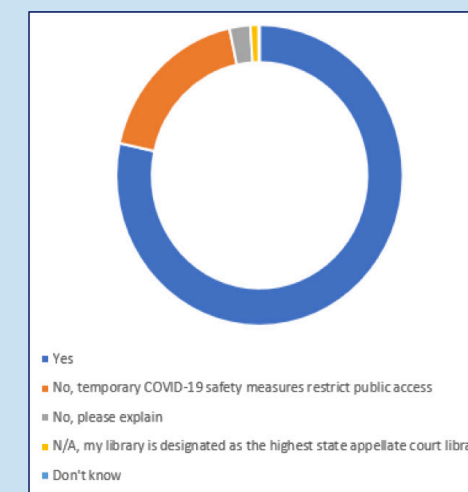


Q14 – Does your library have tangible depository material in any format?

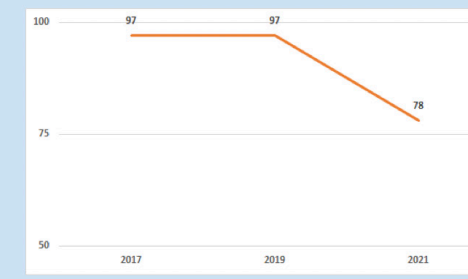
Q21 – How much % of your tangible collection (paper, microfiche, etc.) would you estimate is cataloged?

Q03 – Can anyone enter the library and use Federal Government depository resources free of charge at your library?



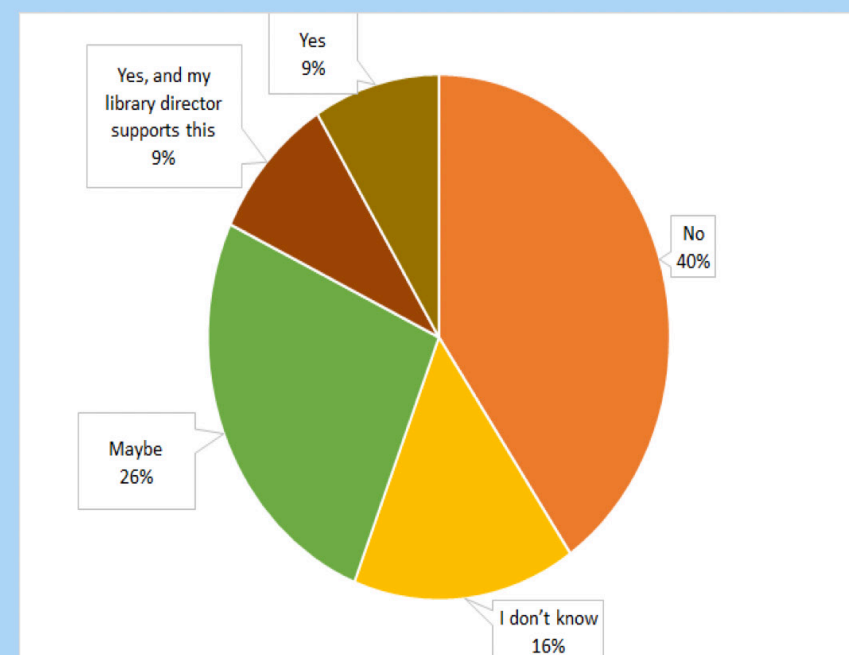
Percentage of FDLs Open to the Public 2017-2021



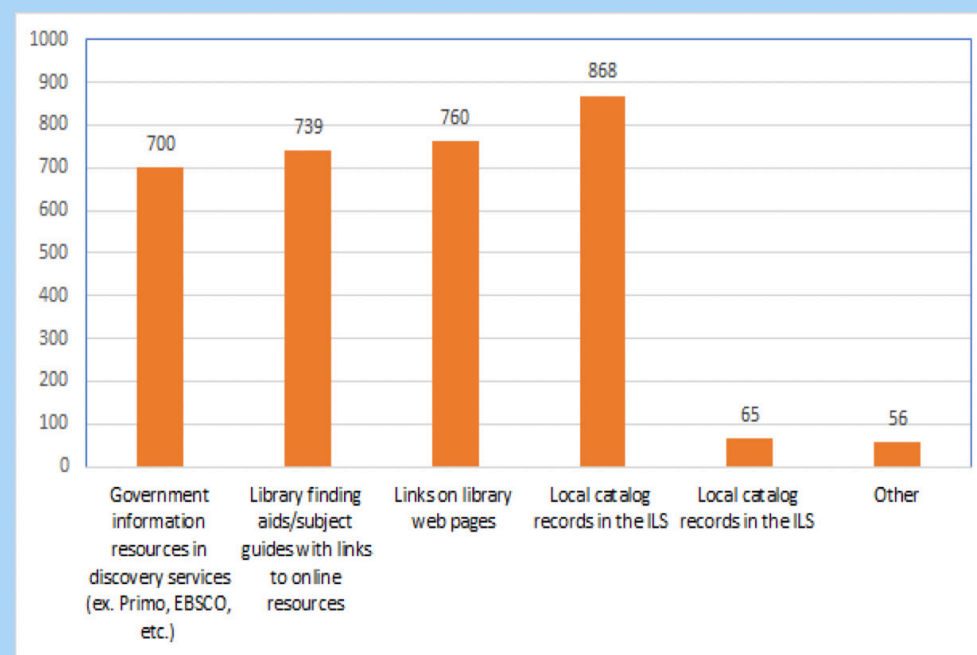

Q12 – Is your library interested in receiving FDL digital publications on deposit from GPO?

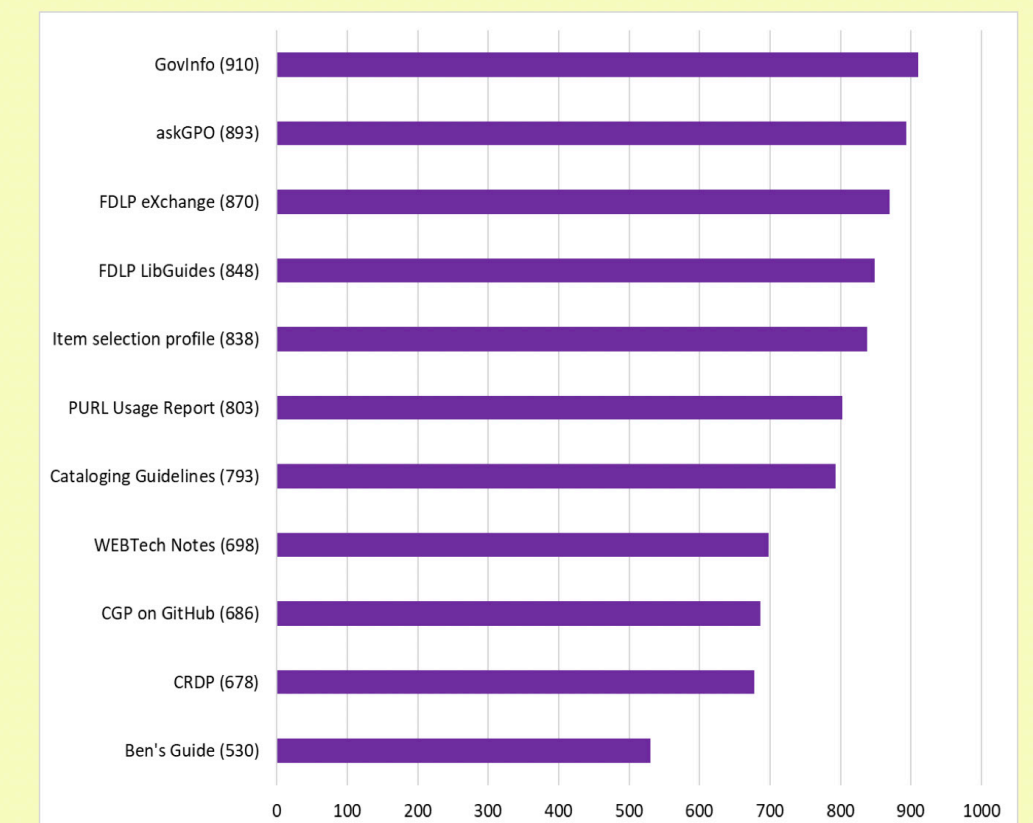


Q4 – Other than providing computers for patron usage, how does your library make online Federal depository publications discoverable?

## TRAINING...AND MORE TRAINING!

A majority of depository libraries are interested in asynchronous training. The top three most requested topics are GovInfo, askGPO, and FDL eXchange.

Training Format	Average Percentage of FDLs Interested in Training Format
Webcast (pre-recorded)	55%
Tutorial	41%
Webinar (live)	37%
Hands-on	8%
