Opening Pandora's Box: Assessing a Government Document Collection

Introduction

The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Library has been a United States Federal Depository Library since 1884. The library's federal depository holdings include over one million items in various media format, such as e-resources, paper documents, and even floppy disks. As a collaboration between members of the Government Information Team and several other units and stakeholders in the library, we developed this project, which aims to assess our large federal government information holdings at the University Library.

With this project, we aim to support the research, teaching and learning needs of the university community and the service mission to the public population. This poster outlines our work on the project so far; due to the project's scope, we are currently continuing with the assessment process as well as outreach/discoverability projects.

Discoverability and Accessibility

During our discussions and process of the project, one challenge that emerged was the difficulties in navigating search engines and databases to find government information and documents. Although we have a lot of valuable sources, it is not easy for our users to have access to this information.

As an end result of the project, we hope to make discoverability/accessibility one of our main goals in order to facilitate understanding and strategies to enhance the use of our collection.

Currently, our unit is partnering with the Acquisitions Department to make search terms in our databases more user-friendly. We also envision that with the inclusion of our future projects (creating LibGuides, Instruction and Outreach efforts, etc.), the information will become more intuitive for our users.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Initiatives

We will be incorporating *Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility* initiatives in our assessment project. We first looked to other library initiatives to inform our understanding of DEIA efforts in collection assessment.

Using the DEIA statement from the University, we began assessing our collection by establishing a clear definition of diversity and a controlled vocabulary to talk about DEIA. To do so we referred to the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility statement from the University Library.

We will continue to center DEIA in our collection assessment project. Some initiatives we might consider is improving accessibility to non-U.S. documents, updating language and metadata terms, identify collection gaps, and promote diverse aspects of our collection. We are also aware of challenges that might arise as we go forward with our efforts like the inequitable practices in government documents and problematic Library of Congress subject headings.



Usage Statistics Assessment

Circulation Statistics

The circulation statistics report was helpful in identifying physical government titles that were circulated the most and discovering patterns in the usage.

FDLP PURL Usage Reports

For the Library's electronic federal collection titles, the Government Publishing Office's (GPO) Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) provides Permanent Uniform Resource Locator (PURL) usage reports for our institution. From these reports, we were able to extract the usage statistics of titles, where the titles were accessed through (catalog, library guides, library website, etc.), and more.

Challenges

One of the main challenges we encountered related to gathering usage statistics. The report only contained the usage statistics of the last two years (2020-2022) due to the implementation of a new Integrated Library System(ILS). Additionally, the Library was closed due to Covid-19 practices for the majority of this time period and a large number of the federal collection was not circulated due to previous policies. Therefore, this data still has limits in representing a comprehensive overview of our collection.

Assessment Process

To begin the assessment process, we began by examining and organizing the selection of federal government titles received by the library through the Federal Depository Library Program.

The list of all GPO documents was then divided by the different agencies. Within the specific agency lists, any duplicate items (those selected in multiple formats) were highlighted. We then turned to the university's list of subject specialist librarians, as they would be consulted on the document selection as part of the assessment process. The different agency/topics lists were then matched to one of the subject specialists. Some agencies did not fall exactly under the purview of any one of the subject specialists; these, as well as documents that fell under her scope, were assessed by the library's Government Information Librarian.

After consulting with the subject specialist librarians, decisions were made to either select or deselect certain items.

Outreach Initiatives and Future Work

Outreach:

Continuing outreach plans include virtual and physical exhibits highlighting the government resources in the library. Additionally, we will be continuing our instruction efforts to provide our users with knowledge and skills to better navigate and find government information. A future project we want to pursue is the creation of new LibGuides highlighting different search strategies in an accessible way.

Further DEI efforts :

Identifying agencies/ subagencies that could produce information on following themes: race, ethnicity, gender, sexual identity, culture, language, socioeconomic status, veteran status, religion, politics, age, neurodiversity, and physical abilities & making selection changes and outreach/promotion efforts to highlight these items.

Discoverability & accessibility :

We will be working with our Acquisitions and Cataloging Services unit in developing new policies and workflows that will ensure better discoverability & accessibility to our government titles. We are also looking into adding a "Government Information" filter to our catalog to improve discoverability of our government titles.
