Preparation for Pilot Project 1 (GPO)

- Project Lead assigned
- Form project team
- Work closely with library to determine scope
 - 200-300 monographs
 - Inventory
 - Preservation Plan
 - Digitization





Preparation for Pilot Project 1 (GPO)

- Letter of Agreement
- Project Documents
- Sub-plans





Site Visit (GPO)

- Examined collection, shelving, etc
- Change of scope
- Condition Assessment
- Send to GPO
- Next steps





Pilot Project 1 - World War II Materials (USU Libraries)

- Regional Collection
 - Partial Cataloging
 - Many gaps in cataloging of pre-1975 materials
 - Selected a discrete collection area with known preservation needs





Pilot Project 1 - Collection Context

SuDoc stem (everything before the colon) used to define "collection areas"

- PR 32
 - This is everything produced under President Roosevelt (FDR).
 - We were particularly interested in identifying temporary wartime agency materials established under the President of the United States.

Pilot Project 1 - Focus & Theme

"This project will strengthen our Government Information Collection by cataloging an under-described area. World War II temporary agencies have strong connections to other library materials. This project will help us establish a collection that supports other Special Collections & Archives materials that describe our agricultural community's context and activities during the war." (USU Libraries Application)

Pilot Project 1 - Preservation

"We will identify strategies for long-term preservation as many of these materials are single page, pamphlet fold, or "pambound" together between flimsy boards. Additionally, the paper is acidic and fragile. Rehousing or de-acidifying pages may be appropriate, which is something the Preservation Coordinator at USU will be able to provide." (USU Libraries Application)





Pilot Project 1 - Contributions to the National Collection

"USU Libraries is committed to enriching the National Collection by inventorying our collection materials not previously described as part of the National Collection (in the Catalog of Government Publications) and by researching collection gaps to fill through acquisitions and needs/offers using FDLP eXchange...

A search of the Catalog of Government Publications (CGP) for the PR 32 SuDoc area does not return any results currently cataloged in the CGP. A title search of a randomized sample of selected materials returned zero results. We estimate that we have up to 200 monograph items across various SuDoc areas (and their wartime agencies). Cataloging these materials will make them discoverable across the entire Federal Depository Library Program and will make them locally discoverable by our patrons through our library catalog." (USU Libraries Application)







Pilot Project 2 - Military technical manuals (UNT)

Military Technical Manuals, or Army Manuals, are a lesser known series that instructed all branches of military on a variety of topics, including vehicles, cooking, weaponry, language, and a sundry of other jobs and duties.

SuDoc Scope:

- W 1.35:

Pilot Project 2 - Military technical manuals (UNT)

Why this collection: The University of North Texas Department of History supports a Military History Center. The Center offers a Ph.D. in military history and hosts a War Studies Symposium. The faculty, students, and fellows who are part of the UNT Military History Center and other researchers will gain better access to this collection of military history if it is available as a digitized collection and has better discoverability in the Libraries' catalog.

UNT Project Goals:

- Enhanced cataloging for better discovery
- Digitization
- Conservation and Preservation of the collection





Pilot Project 2 - Timeline





The Pilot Projects

- Opportunity for LSCM staff to work collaboratively with libraries on cataloging, condition assessment, preservation, digitization, and other areas
- Smaller in scope than comprehensive efforts, but no less impactful
- Can explore alternative processes
- Initiative began with two opportunities that were narrowly focused (Pilot 1), then broader in scope (Pilot 2)





The Pilot Project Process

- Internally, LSCM staff apply project management planning and implementation processes to document, track, and report progress
- Collaboratively, LSCM staff will apply those processes in the pilot through a Pilot Project Participant Agreement as well as regular meetings and communications with the library that include shared understanding of workflows and outcomes

Pilot Project Application

The LSCM Pilot Projects are opportunities for FDLP libraries to collaborate with GPO in areas such as collection inventory, conducting condition assessments, cataloging, and preservation. Jointly conducted projects are to benefit the larger FDLP community and ultimately to enhance access to the National Collection of U.S. Government Public Information.

To be considered for this opportunity, Pliot Project applicants must submit this proposal and obtain administrative approval before the application deadline to participate in this opportunity. All depository libraries are welcome to apply.

Application Instructions

1. Download the Pilot Project Proposal application form

- 2. Answer questions in their entirety, responses to all questions are required for the application to be accepted for review.
- 3. When the Pilot Project Proposal application is complete, please populate the field below stating for which Pilot Project Opportunity your library is applying.
- 4. Finally, attach the Pilot Project Proposal application by clicking "Upload files," then click the submit button. Your library will have then submitted the completed application for the proposed pilot project. The application will be reviewed by the LSCM Pilot Project Review Committee.
