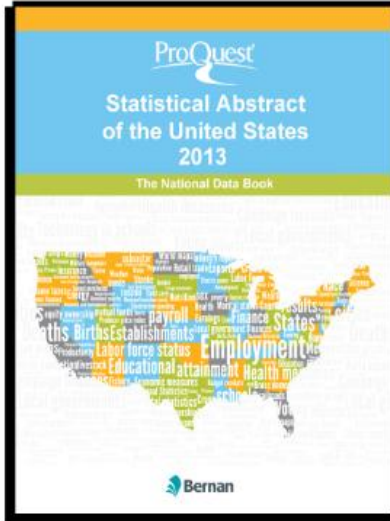
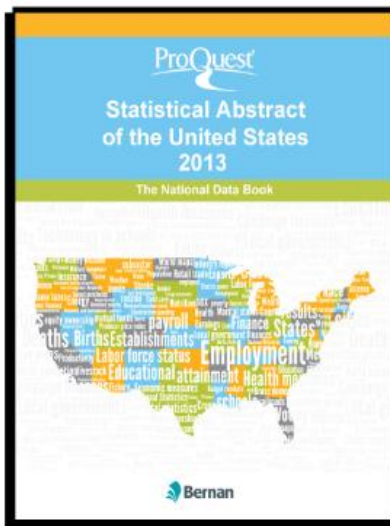
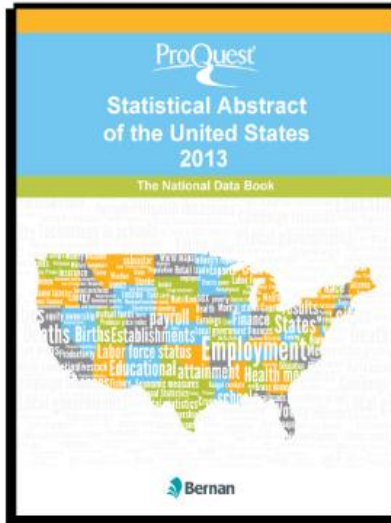

  - *USA Counties* and *State and County QuickFacts* continue.

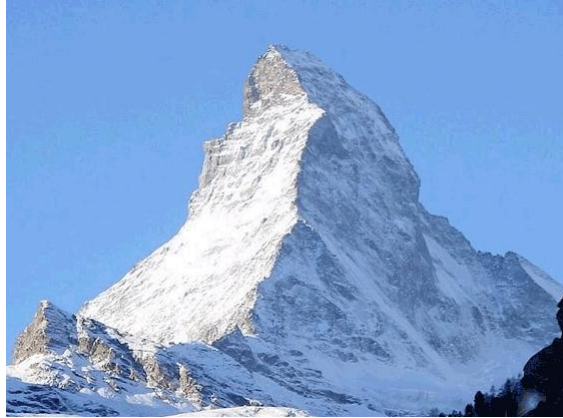

- Update and review the tables.

- Coverage of Federal statistical publications for the past 40 years.
- 25 statistical editors and content analysts.
- 6 acquisitions and licensing specialists focused on statistical content.
- Pre-existing licenses with 30% of the non-Federal providers.
- Opportunity to find efficiencies through technology.

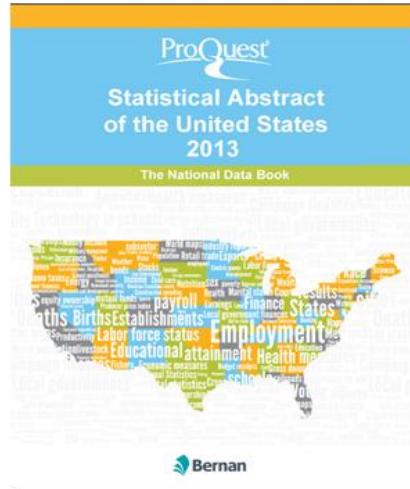
