## **Examining the Effect of Off-Campus College Students on Poverty Rates**

According to the 2009-2011 American Community Survey 3-year data, there were about 23.2 million college students enrolled in colleges in under graduate or graduate studies in the United States. In every state, small towns and big cities, these students mostly reside in college campuses and in concentrated communities around the colleges. Though they are a transient resident population, it is apparent that the demographic and economic characteristics of these students are noticeably reflected in the characteristics of the local communities. In particular, such impacts are more evident in smaller communities. This paper, using the American Community Survey 3-year data, analyzes the impact of college students in particular of those not living with relatives, on the poverty rate of places in which the schools are located. This report excludes college students residing with parents or relatives from its analysis, as their poverty status is determined together with their family.

# **Examining the Effect of Off-Campus College Students on Poverty Rates**

## **Introduction**

According to the 2009-2011 American Community Survey (ACS), there were about 23.2 million students enrolled in colleges and universities in the United States.<sup>1</sup> Many of these students reside on college campuses or in concentrated communities around the colleges. They are mostly young adults, between the ages of 18 and 29.

The demographic and economic characteristics of these students may noticeably shape the demographic and socio-economic characteristics of the local communities where these colleges and universities are located. The impact of these students on local communities varies by the size and location of the schools. In smaller communities, where the students comprise a considerable portion of the local population, the socio-economic characteristics of the communities are directly affected by the characteristics of the student population. However, even in large cities, a big student population living off-campus can impact various socio-economic indicators.

This paper, using the ACS 3-year data (2009-2011), analyzes the impact of college students who are not living with relatives on the poverty rates of states, counties, and places in which the schools are located. To do this, the report calculates poverty rates excluding two groups of college students: those residing with parents or relatives and those living in college dormitories. College students residing with parents or relatives are excluded because their poverty status is determined together with their families. Students living in college dormitories are excluded because they are not part of the poverty universe

used for the official poverty measure. To measure the impact of those college students who are not living with relatives on poverty rates, this paper reports poverty rates for states, counties, and places as they would have been if the off-campus students were not included in the poverty universe.

## Background

This analysis is motivated by the numerous telephone inquiries to the Census Bureau asking about the impact of college/university students on local poverty rates. This has been a particular concern with the release of multi-year data files from the ACS that produce tables for smaller geographies.

These concerns about how college students are treated when calculating poverty rates predate the full implementation of the ACS. For example, Tompkins County New York, the home of Cornell University, has historically paid for a special tabulation of the decennial Census poverty estimates in order to quantify the impact of students on local poverty rates.<sup>2</sup> A 2008 study done by the Ball State University Bureau of Business Research showed poverty rates with and without college students for selected cities with considerable college student populations.<sup>3</sup>

More recently, the Institute on Research on Poverty (IRP) addressed this issue in developing its Wisconsin Poverty Measure.<sup>4</sup> For these statewide estimates, IRP uses an expanded family unit and excludes some undergraduate college students. Specifically, IRP excludes from the universe those students ages 18 to 23 who did not live with relatives, worked less than 13 weeks, typically worked less than 20 hours a week and earned less than \$5,000 per year.

### **WHAT IS THE AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY?**

The American Community Survey (ACS) is a nationwide survey designed to provide communities with reliable and timely demographic, social, economic, and housing data for the nation, states, congressional districts, counties, places, and other localities every year. It has an annual sample size of about 3.3 million addresses across the United States and Puerto Rico and includes both housing units and group quarters (e.g., nursing facilities and prisons). The ACS is conducted in every county throughout the nation, and every municipio in Puerto Rico, where it is called the Puerto Rico Community Survey. Beginning in 2006, ACS data for 2005 were released for geographic areas with populations of 65,000 and greater. ### **Determining Poverty Status**

In most Census Bureau tables, poverty status is determined for all people except those living in institutional group quarters, military barracks, college dormitories, and children under 15 years of age not related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. For people in the poverty universe, poverty status is determined based on total family or personal cash income. For families (those related by birth, marriage or adoption), cash income is summed across all family members and compared to a threshold that depends on the number of adults and children in the family. If a family's total income is less than the applicable threshold, then that family and every individual in it are classified as in poverty. For individuals not living with relatives, personal income is compared to the poverty threshold for a single person. For college students not living in dormitories, poverty status is determined based on their family income (if they live with their families) or personal income (if they live in a nonfamily household or group quarters).

## Nation and States

Figure 1 and Table 1 show the distribution of currently enrolled college students by living arrangement based on the 2009 - 2011 ACS data.<sup>5</sup> Of the total 23.2 million college students in the United States, about 63 percent lived in family households with their parents or relatives, 12 percent lived in dormitories, correctional institutions, military quarters, and in other group quarters, while 25 percent lived off-campus in nonfamily households.<sup>6</sup>

Table 1 also shows the total number of college students and the respective percentage distribution of these students by living arrangement for the 50 states and the District of Columbia. The table reveals a wide variation across the states in the number of college students enrolled. About 33.3 percent of the total number of students enrolled in colleges resided in only four states: California (3.1 million), Florida (1.3 million), New York (1.5 million), and Texas (1.7 million). On the other hand, 9 states (Alaska, Delaware, Maine, Montana, New Hampshire, North Dakota, South Dakota, Vermont, and Wyoming) and the District of Columbia had fewer than 100,000 college students. Among the 50 states and the District of Columbia, the proportion of college students who were living in nonfamily households ranged from 13.3 percent in New Jersey to 40.3 percent in North Dakota.<sup>7</sup> On the other hand, New Jersey had the largest proportion (77.0 percent) of college students living with families or relatives while the District of Columbia had the lowest proportion.

Table 2 summarizes poverty rates before and after excluding college students who were not living with relatives for the U.S., the 50 states and the District of Columbia using the ACS 3-year data. Figure 2 and

Figure 3 show the variations in poverty rates among the states and the effect of excluding college students from the poverty universe on state poverty rates. About 15.2 percent of the total United States population had income below the poverty level and more than half (51.8 percent) of students living off-campus and not living with relatives had income below the poverty level. Excluding these students from the poverty universe, the total poverty rate for the rest of the U.S. population dropped to 14.5 percent.

At the state level, according to 2009-2011 3-year ACS data, poverty rates for all people ranged from 8.4 percent in New Hampshire to 22.2 percent in Mississippi. Excluding college students not living with a family member from the poverty universe resulted in statistically significant, but small, changes in poverty rates for most of the states. Poverty rates declined in all except seven states (Alaska, Delaware, Hawaii, Maine, Nevada, New Hampshire, and New Mexico) after excluding these students from the poverty universe (see Table 2).<sup>8</sup> The seven states with populations of 10 million or more had significant declines in their poverty rates as the result of excluding the students from the poverty universe.<sup>9</sup> Among all states, the size of the decline in poverty rates ranged from 0.3 percent in Alaska to 1.8 percentage points in North Dakota.<sup>10</sup>

## Counties

Table 3 shows poverty rates for the 105 counties with populations of 100,000 or more that experienced a significant change in their poverty rates after excluding off-campus college students.<sup>11</sup> These include 34 counties with populations of at least 500,000 people. The change in the poverty rates after excluding

off-campus college students ranged from 11.7 percentage points in Monroe County, Indiana to 0.6 percentage point in Maricopa County, Arizona.<sup>12</sup>

Table 4 shows poverty rates with and without off-campus college students for counties with populations between 65,000 and 100,000 experiencing significant changes in poverty rates. Only 16 of the 217 counties of this population size had significantly lower poverty rates after excluding these college students from the poverty universe. For example, Monongalia County, West Virginia where the University of West Virginia is located, had its poverty rate drop from about 23.0 percent to 12.6 percent. Similarly, the poverty rate fell from 21.0 percent to 11.5 percent for Tompkins County, New York, home of Cornell University. The percentage point change in the poverty rate for these counties with significant changes ranged from 2.3 percentage points for Walworth County, Wisconsin to 13.0 percentage points for Montgomery County, Virginia.<sup>13</sup>

Table 5 presents poverty rates for counties with populations between 20,000 and 65,000 with and without off-campus college students. Only 41 of the 1,062 counties of this size experienced statistically significant declines in poverty rates when excluding students. For example, in Latah County, Idaho where the University of Idaho is located, excluding students would lower its poverty rate from 20.4 percent to 12.4 percent. The percentage point changes in poverty rate for this group of counties ranged from 2.5 for Otsego County, New York to 16.5 for Whitman County, Washington.<sup>14</sup>

Appendix Table 3 shows poverty rates including recalculated rates after excluding off-campus college students from the poverty universe for all counties (1,844 counties) with a population of 20,000 or more.

## Places

Table 6 shows 49 cities with significant declines in poverty rates when excluding off-campus college students. Of these, 13 were large cities with populations of 500,000 or more (New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Philadelphia, San Diego, San Francisco, Austin, Columbus, Seattle, Boston, Portland, Washington, DC, and Tucson). The declines in the poverty rates for these cities with significant changes ranged from 0.4 percentage point for New York City, New York to 15.5 percentage points for Gainesville city, Florida.<sup>15</sup>

Table 7 shows the 20 places with populations between 65,000 and 100,000 which experienced statistically significant changes in poverty rates after excluding off-campus college students. The changes in the poverty rates for these cities ranged from 2.7 percentage points for Richardson city, Texas (University of Texas) to 19.3 percentage points for Bloomington city, Indiana (Indiana University) and 20.7 percentage points for College Station city, Texas (Texas A & M University).<sup>16</sup>

Of about 1,602 smaller places with populations between 20,000 and 65,000, Table 8 shows the 71 with significant changes in their poverty rates. The percentage point declines for the places with significant declines ranged from 3.5 percentage points for University Park city, Texas to 34.7 percentage points for State College borough, Pennsylvania.<sup>17</sup>

Appendix Table 4 displays poverty rates with and without off-campus college students for all places with populations of 20,000 or more (2,115). For most of these places, the table shows across-the-board lower poverty rates when college students were excluded. However, these changes were statistically significant for only 140 places.

## **Conclusion**

While the poverty rates for most states would be lower if off-campus college students were excluded from the poverty universe, the declines in the state poverty rates would be quite modest. However, at finer levels of geography there are counties and places where the inclusion of off-campus college students has a stronger impact on poverty rates. For some purposes, state and local planners may want to consider using an alternative poverty measure that excludes these students.<sup>18</sup>

## **SOURCE AND ACCURACY**

The Data presented in this report are based on the ACS sample interviewed between 2009 and 2011. The estimates based on this sample approximate the actual values and represent the entire household and group quarters population. Sampling error is the difference between an estimate based on the sample and the corresponding value that would be obtained if the estimate were based on the entire population (as from a census). Measures of the sampling errors are provided in the form of margins of error for estimates included in this report. All comparative statements in this report have undergone statistical testing, and comparisons are significant at the 90 percent confidence level unless otherwise

noted. In addition to sampling error, nonsampling error may be introduced during any of the operations used to collect and process survey data such as editing, reviewing, or keying data from questionnaires.



## Distribution of Students Enrolled in Colleges by Living Arrangements : 2009-2011



2009-2011**


