- Identify state-of-the-art thinking and practice in balancing digital and print maps.
- \* Understand and articulate the needs of Temple University researchers with respect to their need for print maps and to what extent they will continue to depend on the Libraries for access to maps
- Recommend a policy that will guide the current retention of print maps and future development of a map collection at Temple University
- \* Recommend to what extent it is necessary to maintain the map file cabinets on the first floor – East of Paley or in/adjacent to reference collection services in any future building

#### Recommendations

- \* the paper map collection be evaluated and weeded, in consultation with faculty, according to their availability online and frequency of use, and by SCRC staff for possible inclusion in SCRC holdings.
- \* focus of a map collection policy be on digital and paper flat maps
- \* the library, in consultation with faculty, begin to collect examples of historically important maps, to support a history of cartography program
- the library identify a research specialty area in which to collect maps
