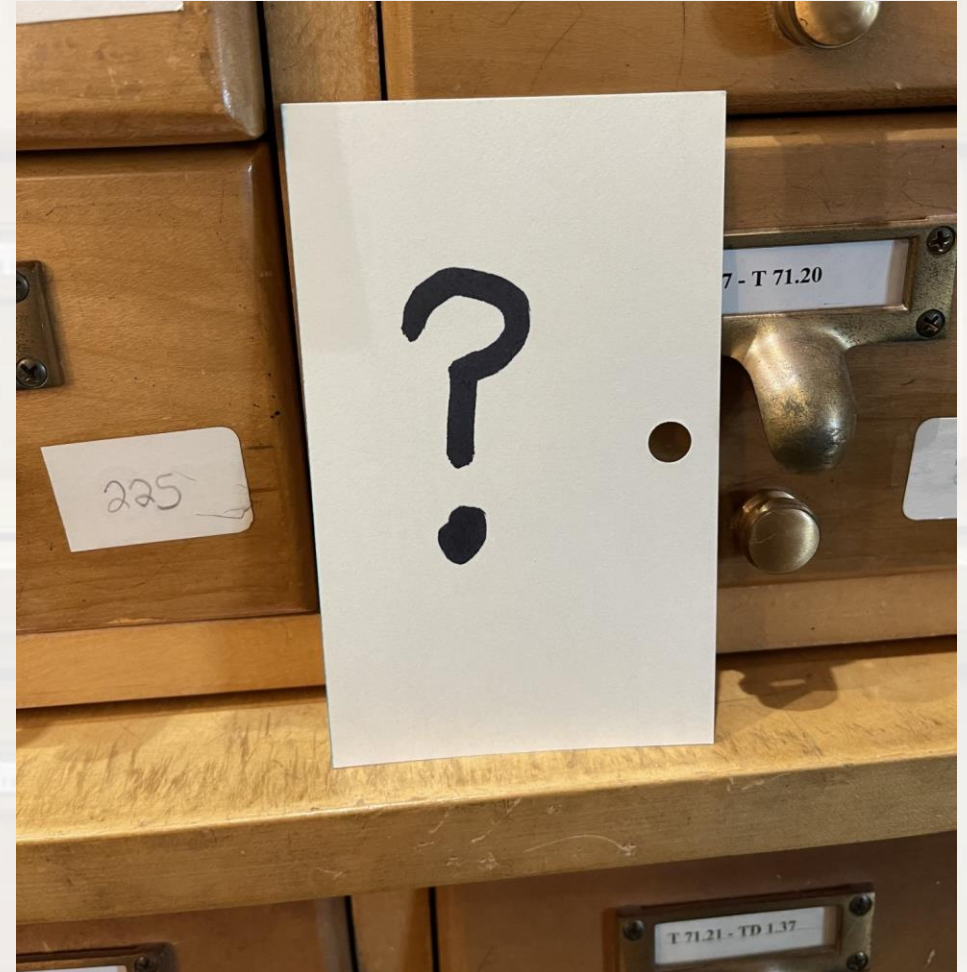

We were reorganized and the Federal Depository Unit at the University of Kentucky was moved from Collections to Special Collection. This raised several BIG QUESTIONS.

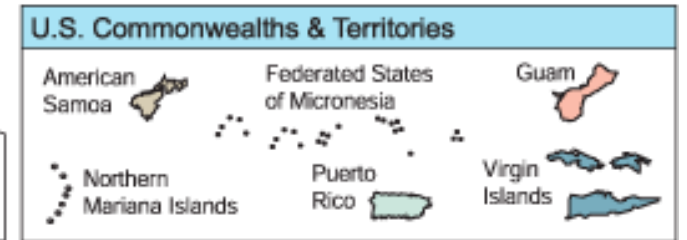
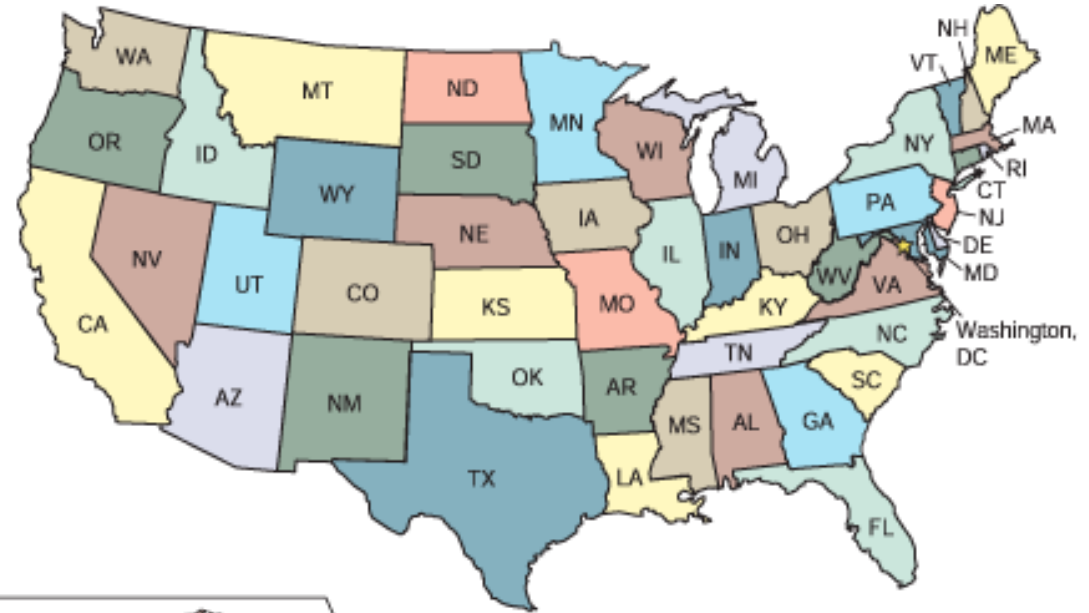
- **Where are other regionals located within their organizations?**
- **Does that location within an organization have an impact on depository services now and in the future as we move to a digital FDLP?**



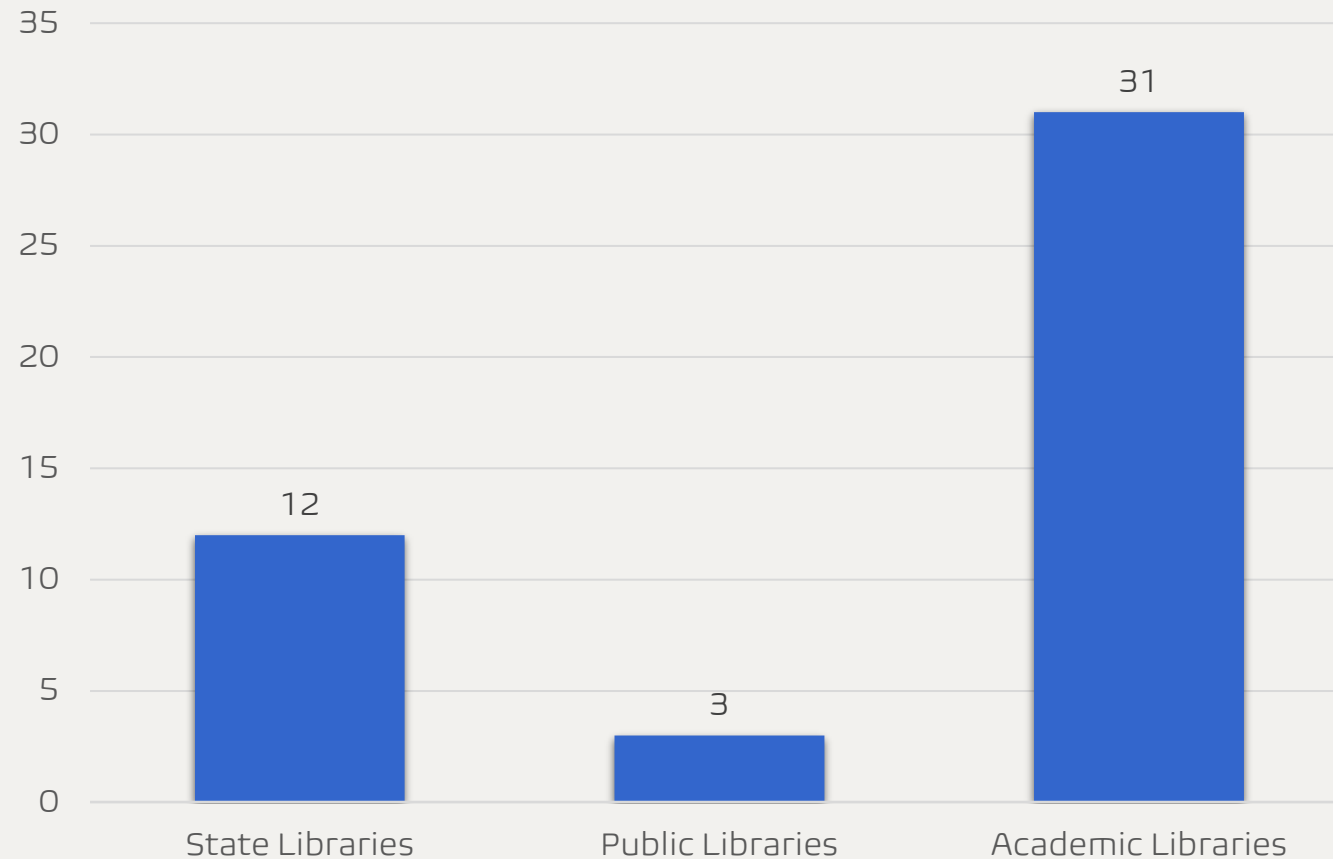
History of the FDLP at the University of Kentucky

■ Regional Federal Depository Library by Type

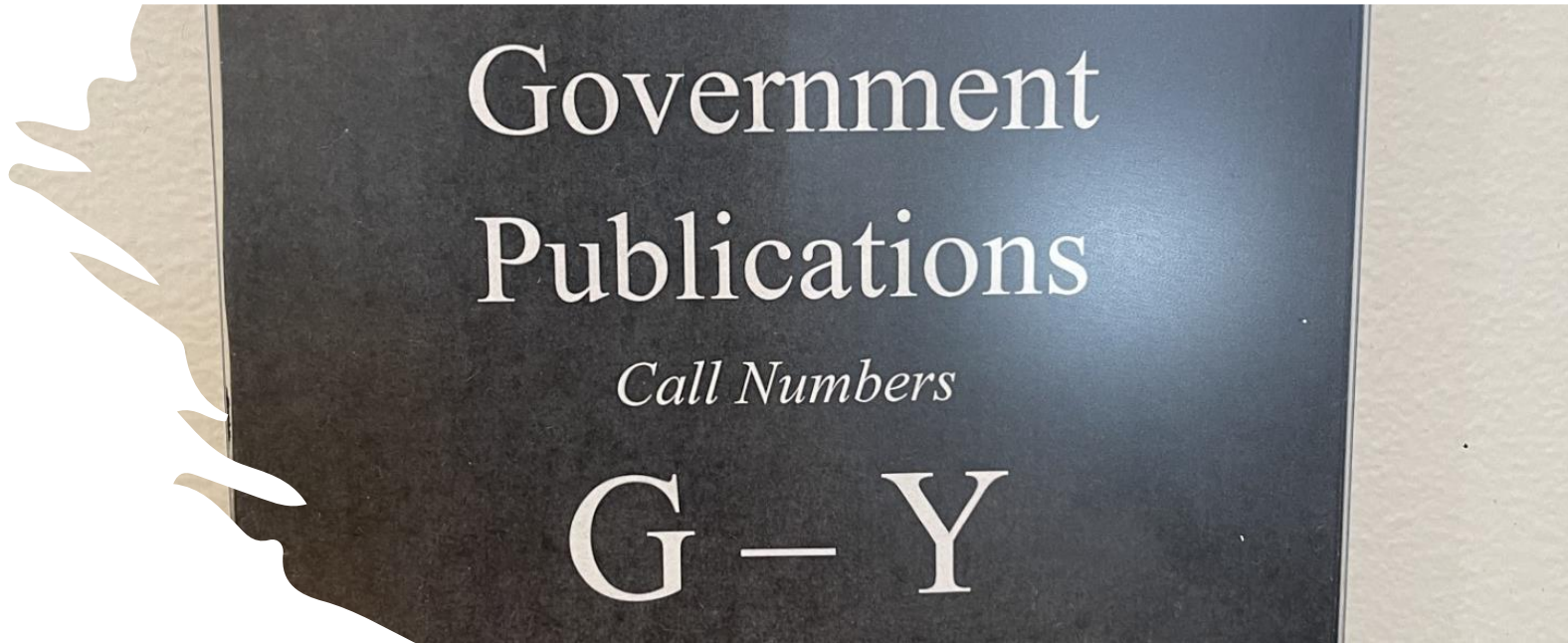

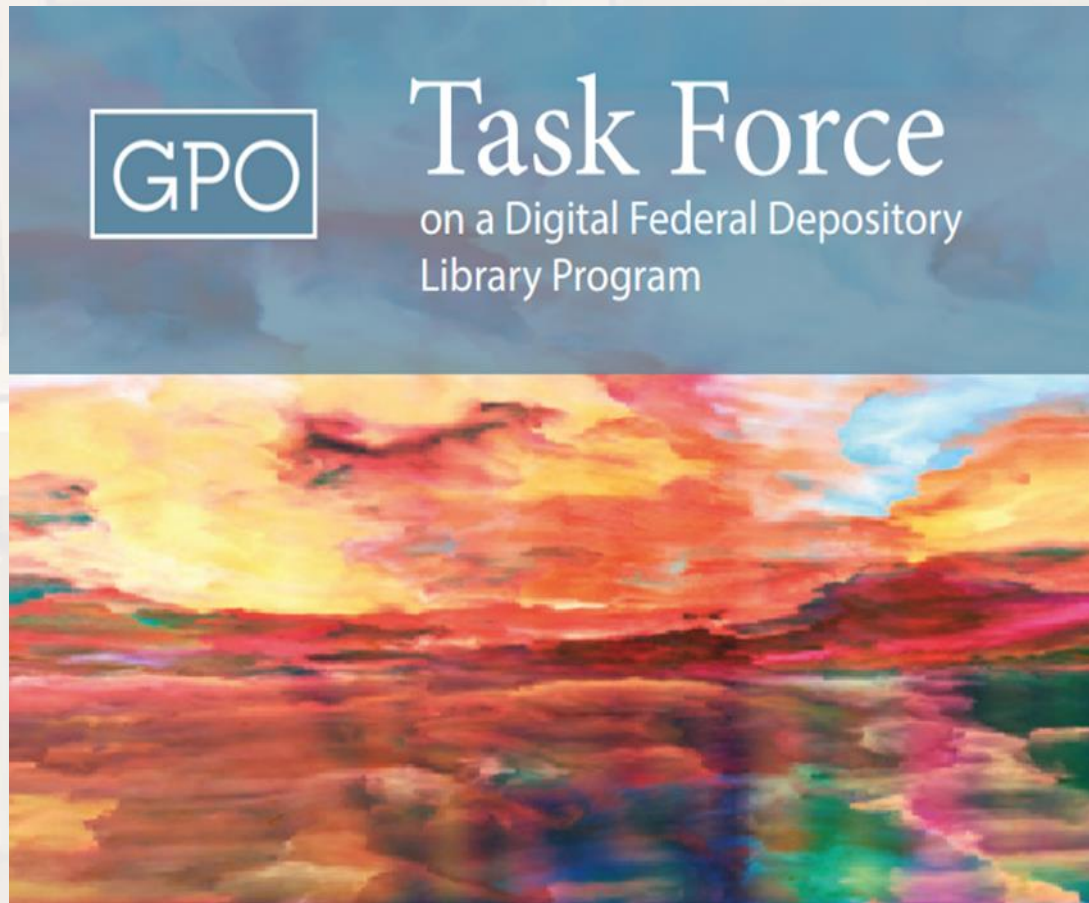
