Initiative Idea and Beta Period

- Development of the process is an outgrowth of our work with the GovInfo API.
- In 2020, started to use the API to convert the MODS metadata for hearings into preliminary MARC records.
- LTS expert staff members complete the records in OCLC and add them to the CGP.
- Built the bills and resolutions process on this model.
- Beta period launch soon.
- First set of records available in the CGP.
- CGP expert mode search: WLTS=BILLSRESOLUTIONS



Goals

- Provide an introductory level of access to publications that LTS does not currently catalog.
- Represent these critical elements of the legislative process in the CGP.
- These materials are prime candidates for automated processing.
- Develop a new product for the FDLP community and expand our operational infrastructure and processes.



Process Overview

- This is the first iteration of this process.
- Transform selected GovInfo MODS elements into MARC records and apply a series of updates and additions to the records.
- Scope includes all types of House and Senate bills and resolutions.
- Catalog bills and resolutions as integrating resources.
- Evaluate each set of records to identify issues and enhancements.



Development Method

- Took an incremental and iterative approach.
- Segmented the process based on our experiences with other batch processing work, such as the Serial Set Project.
- Compiled metadata specifications based on our research and consultations.
- Examined the metadata and publications to identify opportunities for individual processing rules.
- Combined the rules into a process.



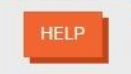

Research

- Reviewed *Resource Description & Access and Cataloging Legal Literature* for guidance.
- Checked sample records in OCLC and the CGP.
- To scope the dimensions of this initiative, looked at the contents of the GovInfo Congressional Bills Collection.
- Looked at the contents by Congress and year.
- Compiled preliminary data to assess the number of records we may generate.

About Congressional Bills

Congressional bills are legislative proposals from the House of Representatives and Senate within the United States Congress. There are eight different types of bills.

There are numerous different bill versions that track a bill through the legislative process from introduction through passage by both chambers (enrolled version). All final published bill versions are available from GPO

This site contains all published versions of bills from the 103rd (1993-1994) Congress forward. The system is updated by 6 a.m. (EST) daily when bills are published and approved for release. [Read More](#)

Collaboration

- Discussed our draft plan with:
 - Programs, Strategy, and Technology
 - Congressional Research Service
 - Depository Library Council Subcommittee on Collection and Discovery Services
 - OCLC Quality Control.
- All provided critical input and expertise.
- LTS staff member cataloged one record of each type of bill and resolution in OCLC and the CGP.
- Conferred with LTS subject matter experts for their suggestions and recommendations.
- Responses were positive and supportive.



Testing Procedures

- Produced test records.
- Evaluated and studied them.
- Enumerated modifications, deletions, and additions.
- Incorporated the changes into the process.
- Repeated these steps for multiple rounds of records and review.



Cataloging/Metadata Overview

- MARC encoding level 3 (Abbreviated), because batch processed and not viewed.
- All have OCLC numbers and full SuDoc numbers.
- No FDLP item numbers.
- PURLs to the Related Documents tab as that page displays the major metadata elements and the links to the other versions of the bills and resolutions and post-enactment documents.
- URLs to the Congress.gov summary page as that displays a great deal of information about the actions taken on each measure and links to other resources.



Integrating Resources Treatment

- Represent the stages, versions, and actions of bills and resolutions as they proceed through the legislative process and various versions are published.
- Multiple versions of a bill or resolution may be published in GovInfo, and multiple actions may be documented in Congress.gov.
- Together GovInfo and Congress.gov offer a comprehensive presentation of the life cycle of bills and resolutions.
- Based on consultations and the resources' characteristics, concluded that integrating resources treatment is the best approach.
- LTS cataloging/metadata policy subject matter experts approved this.



Federal Depository Library Program Item Numbers

- LSCM decided not to include item numbers in the records due to the high volume of records.
- The records are available in OCLC and the CGP.
- We offer files of the records on GitHub.



Superintendent of Documents Classification Numbers

- Our classification experts determined the formulation of the SuDoc numbers as based on the stems, the Congress number, session number, and bill or resolution number.
- Use the MODS document type to identify the SuDoc stem and add the components into full SuDoc numbers.
- As integrating resources records, we add the terminal slash.
- Y 1.4/6:118-1/5133/
- Y 1.4/7:118-1/183/



New Fields and Procedures

- Testing the inclusion of new fields, such as:
 - Referred bill
 - Referred date
 - Branch of government
- Explored the use of the Congress.gov Policy Areas terms to provide access to the public policy facets of the measures.
- Looked at the jurisdictions of the committees in the House and Senate Rules.
- Mapped that information very approximately to Congress.gov Policy Areas terms and Library of Congress Subject Headings.

Title Capitalization Issues

- For the most part, the MARC 245 and 246 titles adhere to the RDA capitalization and *Chicago Manual of Style* guidelines.
- Some titles may contain words that are not capitalized according to the guidelines.
- Continue to improve and enhance procedures for capitalization of titles.



Quality Control Procedures

- Records will not be created when the required elements are not found in the GovInfo metadata.
- Those publications will be listed in a log that we will review.
- Resolve items as quickly as possible.
- For major changes and developments, produce and review test records.
- LTS staff members will spot check records, report errors and issues, and recommend changes and additions.
- We will try our best to incorporate suggestions from the FDLP community.



Beta Period Parameters

- Beta period of approximately six months.
- First set of records on GitHub: MARC and MARC XML files of the 256 House bills and resolutions published in August in GovInfo.
- Retrieve the records with expert mode search.
- Run the process every month.



GitHub Repository

- Post the files in a collection in the Catalog of U.S. Government Publications (CGP) Records Maintenance Files repository.
- This repository contains various files for FDLs to manage the GPO records in their catalogs and for collection development and management purposes.
- Beta period: monthly files of new records and cumulative files of all records.
- After the beta period, the plan is to post quarterly files of new records and cumulative files.
- Post MARC and MARC XML files.
