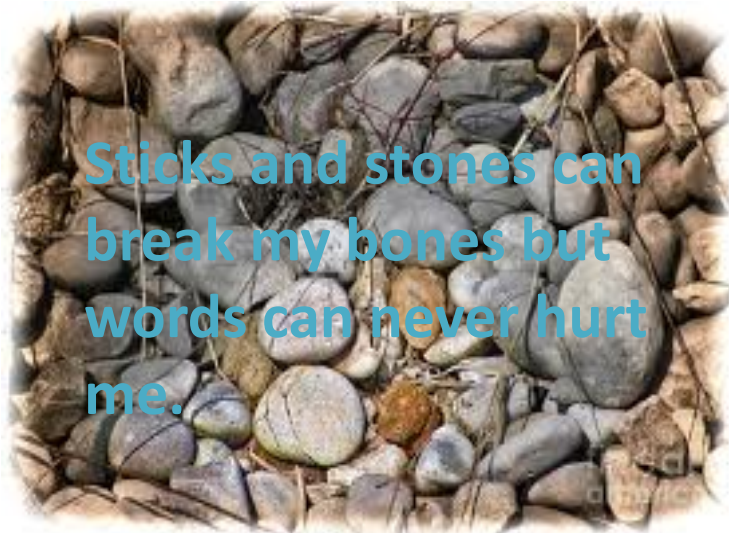

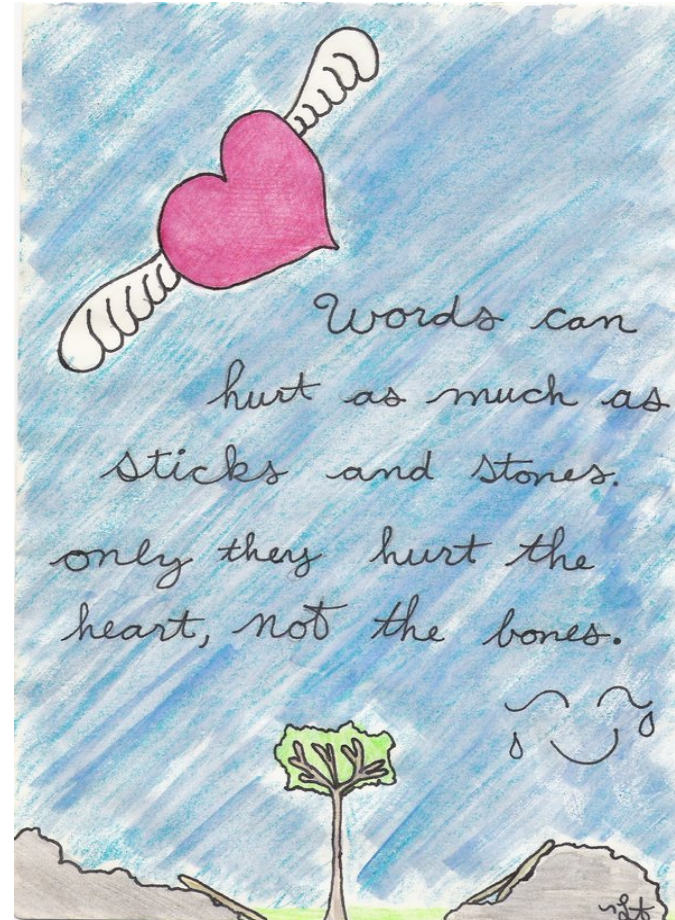

Bullying: Definition/ Definición

Repeated, unreasonable actions of individuals or a group which are intended to intimidate, degrade, humiliate, or undermine.

Acciones negativas y repetidas, durante un tiempo, por parte de una o mas personas. Incluye palabras repugnantes y desagradables.

Statistics on bullying

29.9% of students from 6th through 10th grade report frequent participation in bullying, either as victim or aggressor (Espelage, 2003).

41.4% of US workers report experiencing psychological aggression at work in the past year. 13% report experiencing bullying on a weekly basis.

Younger students are more likely to report bullying than others (24% in 6th grade versus 7% in 12th grade. More white students than black or Hispanic students report bullying. No differences in bullying were detected between public and private schools. (National Center for Educational Statistics, 2005).

More Statistics on Bullying

Workers over the age of 45 are more likely to be subjected to bullying.

Workplaces with less than 50 workers are more likely to have bullying incidents.

47.2% of workplace bullying are vertically-descending cases.
