As the FDLP becomes a digital-first program, GPO will reduce tangible distribution to libraries in early 2024. The number of titles and copies available for print distribution will decrease as GPO delivers permanent no-fee public access to digital content for people seeking U.S. Government information. This limited print distribution model acknowledges the different print needs and requirements of the NCSAs.

A digital FDLP prioritizes digital permanent public access while preserving the historic print collection.

<u>The Print Distribution Titles List (PDT)</u> consists of titles that will continue to be distributed in paper-format. Please review the PDT to determine which titles your library needs to continue to receive in print.

During the November 14-17 NCSA meetings, we will:

- 1. Gather feedback to inform the collaborative development of criteria for print distribution in each NCSA.
- 2. Review requirements and commitments depository libraries will need to make to receive print material:
 - a. Follow 44 U.S.C. § 1911 requirement to retain for five years, but also agree not to supersede or electronically substitute.
 - b. Commit to offer nationally in FDLP eXchange once the five-year retention commitment has been met.
 - c. Commit to catalog and make all print receipts discoverable via the library's integrated library system (ILS) to support interlibrary loan on or in-library access to the print format.
