Digital FDLP Implementation

- November 2023
 - Meetings with each National Collection Service Area (NCSA) to discuss criteria for print
 - Questionnaire sent to all libraries to request PDT titles
 - Questionnaires were due December 22, 2023
 - 731 responses
- LSCM and the Superintendent of Documents determined the allocation of titles to libraries.
 - DLC members were sent the initial allocations for feedback.
 - On January 17, 2024, libraries receiving print were notified and acknowledged retention requirements.
- February 1: Title allocations lists were shared with the FDLP community.
- February 2024, transition month for distribution
 - Sent out the last of pre-PDT tangible titles
 - Began distribution of the new PDT titles
 - Item selection profiles were updated February 22
 - DSIMS bulk updates were completed on March 24
- Updates are currently underway to the List of Classes.

FY24

- Complete the digitization of the U.S. Reports
- Continue to add Congressional hearings and prints to GovInfo

FY25

- [Serial Set](#) and Congressional hearings work continues
- Develop the U.S. Reports collection on GovInfo
- Add depository shipping lists, agency annual reports, and independent commission material

Updates:

- The University of Idaho Libraries committed to preserve their U.S. Forest Service collection as a Preservation Steward.
- Outreach has begun to potential Preservation Stewards for PDT list titles.
- Digital Content Contributors:
 - Boise State University added 7 publications to GovInfo.
 - University of Memphis added 17 publications to GovInfo.
 - Indiana State Library added 4 publications to GovInfo.

LSCM Pilot Project 1

- Utah State University, Merrill-Cazier Library selected for PP1
- Catalog, digitize, and ingest into GovInfo
- Approximately 3,000 FDR- era Civil Defense documents
- GPO visited in Spring 2022
- Project scope extended
- Records available late spring: PilotProject1USU
- In GovInfo early fall



LSCM Pilot Project 2

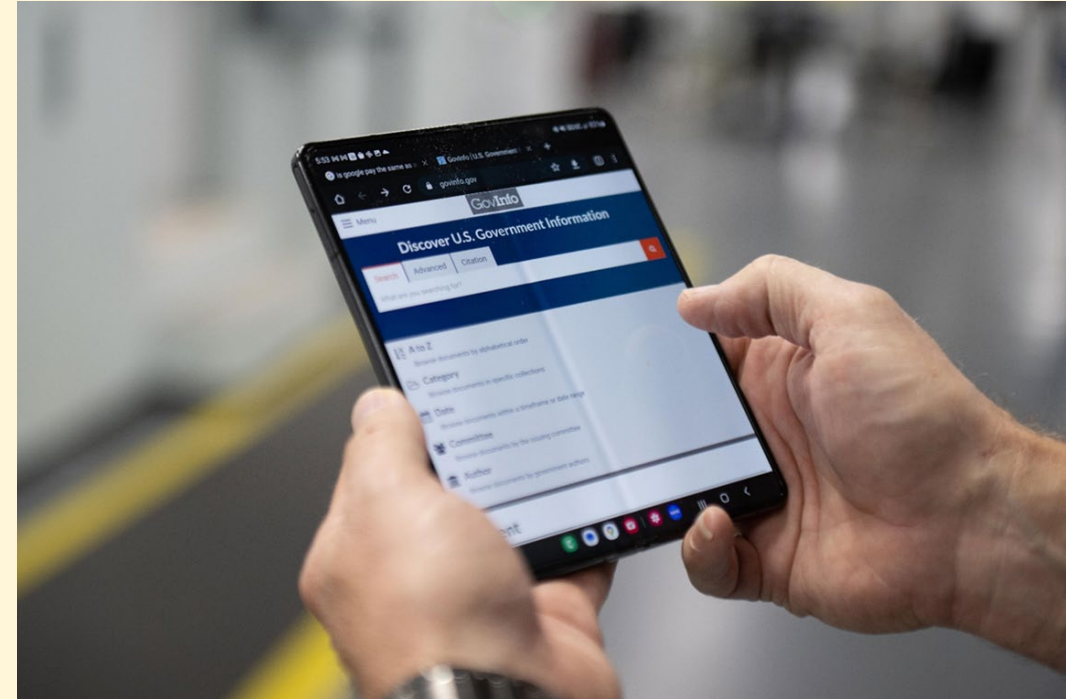

- Open for submissions March – April 2022.
- UNT Libraries was selected for PP2 in July 2022.
- Both collection and item-level assessment complete, and the digital-imaging work is underway.
- Plan includes inventorying, condition assessment, and digital imaging, with goals of providing access to 640 military technical manuals from World War II and the post-war period via GovInfo, the UNT Digital Library, and CGP records.
- Titles will also be included in the UNT Libraries Preservation Steward collections.

- GPO became certified under CoreTrustSeal in December 2023.

Biennial Survey/State of the FDLP Report

- 2023 Biennial Survey: September 27 – December 8, 2023.
- The survey is the mechanism through which depositories fulfill their legal obligation to “report to the Superintendent of Documents at least every two years concerning their condition” (44 USC §1909).
- From December 8, 2023 – February 29, 2024, staff in Federal Depository Support Services continued outreach to survey non-responders.
- The final dataset of 1,045 responses (94% response rate) compiled in March 2024 is [available on FDLP.gov](#), along with a preview of the questions.
- Analysis of the survey responses is ongoing.
- The survey’s accompanying State of the FDLP report will be released on FDLP.gov by the end of September 2024.

 - New educational handouts on Federal holidays – under development

How to Find U.S. Government Publications

U.S. Government publications are arranged by the Superintendent of Documents classification number. Publications are grouped together by issuing agency. To ensure that you find all of the materials available on a particular subject, be sure to check the databases or indexes recommended by your librarian.

The example below shows how the Superintendent of Documents classification number **JU 6:8:577** is constructed for the publication **United States Reports**.

FDLP Data Manager (FDM)

- FDM, launched in March 2024, is a collection management tool that can help process, catalog, and develop FDLP collections.
- Code for the Documents Data Miner tool was acquired from Wichita State University and redeveloped for GPO to host locally.
- Modules make use of data from shipping lists, List of Classes files, FDL Directory, and MARC catalog records.

SuDoc Classification Numbers Corrections Policy

- Effective March 1, 2024, LSCM implemented the following policies on changing the Superintendent of Documents classification (SuDoc) numbers in GPO records in the CGP and OCLC.
 - LTS will change the SuDoc numbers in records for FDLP publications up to 10 years after the distribution year.
 - When the distribution year is unknown, LTS will use the cataloging year.
 - LTS will not change the SuDoc numbers in records that are exclusively for Cataloging and Indexing Program materials.

*** FDLs may change the SuDoc numbers in records in their systems or OCLC at their discretion. FDLs can continue to add an X at the end of the SuDoc numbers that they create or change.



CGP on GitHub

- LSCM collaborated on the annual snapshot of the MARC bibliographic records in the CGP.
- The files contain the 1,080,961 records in the CGP as of February 2024, except for brief bibliographic records. That figure is an increase of 58,079 records (6%) over the 2023 snapshot.
- LTS posted the record files in the two GitHub repositories: [MARC UTF-8](#) and [MARC XML](#).
- LSCM collaborated on the creation of the new [Legal Publications Collection](#) in the [CGP on GitHub repository](#).
- Contains a set of tangible publications and a set of online publications. The tangible record set was created from the [Print Distribution Titles](#) (PDT) list. The titles were chosen because more than half of FDLP law libraries have selected them for their collections as of 2023.



Congressional Research Service Reports

- New workflows have greatly improved cataloging efficiency for Congressional Research Service (CRS) Reports, including a collaboration with the CRS to generate monthly reports of new publications, and the development of an automated process to generate preliminary records and PURLs.
- These improvements have allowed GPO to stay current in cataloging newly-published reports each month.
- To date, LTS staff have cataloged over 10,388 separate, unique CRS report titles, which is approximately 87% of all reports available on the site.
- The records can be retrieved in the CGP by this expert mode search: [wlts=CRSREP](#). The records are available in the [Congressional Research Service Reports collection](#) of the [CGP on GitHub repository](#).



Law Library of Congress Historical Reports Records

- In December 2023, Library Technical Services completed the project begun in 2020 in collaboration with the Law Library of Congress to digitize and catalog the materials in the [Law Library of Congress Historical Reports Collection](#).
- LTS processed and cataloged 3,930 records in the CGP and OCLC.
- The records are available for downloading for free from the [Law Library of Congress Reports Collection](#) of the [CGP on GitHub repository](#).
- The Law Library of Congress submits new reports to GPO that LTS catalogs and adds to the collection.
- LTS compiled several metrics about the records and posted the data tables on the [LTS Data tab](#) of the [LSCM Library Technical Services Information Portal](#) resource guide.



New Version of Resource Description & Access (RDA)

- LTS is preparing to adopt the new iteration of the RDA cataloging standard, known as “Official RDA.”
- As a member of the Program for Cooperative Cataloging (PCC), LTS is following PCC’s lead.
- In FY 2023, LTS served on the PCC’s Task Group to Test the Official RDA Toolkit.
- A small group of LTS staff members are attending the PCC Introductory RDA Training webinar series.
- PCC has a three-year rolling implementation plan from May 1, 2024 – April 30, 2027.
- As of Feb. 2024, LTS has a small group working on a local implementation plan for Official RDA.
- When a specific implementation date is finalized by LTS, it will be announced by LSCM.
