The Library Services and Content Management (LSCM) business unit of the U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) began digital imaging works of the U.S. Government in 2016. The overall objective of digital imaging is to increase public access to historic Federal Government information by making it available digitally on [GovInfo](#), and ultimately to make the entire [National Collection of U.S. Government Information](#) available digitally.



[GPO's System of Online Access Collection Development Plan](#) support's GovInfo to make it the "most comprehensive information repository serving the information needs of Congress, Federal agencies, and the public" and entails the ingest of current and historical content. LSCM reevaluates the Plan's deliberate priority setting and planned collecting activities and goals annually.

LSCM utilizes two avenues to acquire digital images: digital imaging through contract vehicles and content digitally imaged by partners. Consider partnering with GPO to make

STATUTE I.

CHAPTER I.—*An Act to regulate the Time and Manner of administering certain Oaths.* June 1, 1789.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and [House of] Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the oath or affirmation required by the sixth article of the Constitution of the United States, shall be administered in the form following, to wit: "I, A. B. do solemnly swear or affirm (as the case may be) that I will support the Constitution of the United States." The said oath or affirmation shall be administered within three days after the passing of this act, by any one member of the Senate, to the President of the Senate, and by him to all the members and to the secretary; and by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, to all the members who have not taken a similar oath, by virtue of a particular resolution of the said House, and to the clerk: and in case of the absence of any member from the service of either House, at the time prescribed for taking the said oath or affirmation, the same shall be administered to such member, when he shall appear to take his seat.

The FCC makes individual documents available as released in the [Electronic Document Management System \(EDOCS\)](#). The EDOCS repository contains full records from March 1996 to present, and brief records which may contain documents and associated metadata for releases between 1982 and 1996.

The University of North Texas, a GPO Digital Preservation Steward, makes digitized copies of the FCC Record available from 1986 to present in the [UNT Digital Library](#).

About the Congressionally Mandated Reports

Congressionally mandated reports are defined as those reports that are required by statute to be submitted by Federal agencies to the Senate, the House of Representatives, or to congressional committees or subcommittees. Agencies must now also submit these reports electronically to the U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) after first submitting to Congress, committees, or subcommittees as they do currently.

Not all congressionally mandated reports are required to be submitted to GPO for publication. The congressionally mandated reports in GovInfo are those that are in scope of Public Law 117-263, the James M. Inhofe National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2023, sections 7241-7248, cited as the “Access to Congressionally Mandated Reports Act.”

The mission of the [Bureau of Ocean Energy Management \(BOEM\)](#) is to manage development of U.S. Outer Continental Shelf energy and mineral resources in an environmentally and economically responsible way. The Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act of 1953 authorizes Federal leasing and management of submerged lands for energy development. These responsibilities evolved in the [US Department of the Interior \(USDOI\)](#), initially within the Bureau of Land Management and the US Geologic Survey Conservation Division, then with the creation of the USDOI's Minerals Management Service in 1982, and now with BOEM.

The Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) [↗](#) is an independent agency in the executive branch of the federal government serving the nation's railroad workers and their families. The agency's enabling statutes, the Railroad Retirement Act and the Railroad Unemployment Insurance Act, grant the RRB the authority to administer comprehensive retirement, survivor, and unemployment-sickness benefit programs.

Find Railroad Retirement Board Publications

Board Coverage Decisions (BCDs) are final agency decisions that determine employer and employee status under the Railroad Retirement Act and the Railroad Unemployment Insurance Act. For an employer these decisions determine whether it is required to pay taxes under the Railroad Retirement Tax Act and follow the RRB's rules and regulations. For employees these decisions determine whether their work history makes them eligible for benefits under the acts.

This is a curated collection of BCDs. Every available employer coverage decision is in the database, while only a select number of employee service decisions are included. The selected employee service decisions discuss and analyze classes of employees, rather than individual cases. If you require searching the entire collection, please contact the National Archives and Records Administration.




Budget of the United States Government

Issued by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), the Budget of the United States Government is a collection of documents that contains the budget message of the President, information about the President's budget proposals for a given fiscal year, and other budgetary publications that have been issued throughout the fiscal year. Other related and supporting budget publications are included, which may vary from year to year.


