Purpose & Overview

- Certification under ISO 16363 will reinforce GPO's commitment to its mission of ensuring permanent public access to Federal Government information
- This project is a collaborative process between many different areas of GPO: Library Services & Content Management (LSCM); Programs, Strategy, and Technology (PST); Acquisitions and Finance; Plant Operations; and Information Technology (IT)





Project Scope

- The certification process encompasses a set of 109 criteria
 - Organizational Infrastructure
 - Governance and Organizational Viability
 - Organizational Structure and Staffing
 - Preservation Policy and Framework
 - Financial Sustainability
 - Digital Object Management
 - Acquisition of Content
 - Creation of Archival Information Package
 - Preservation Planning
 - Access Management
 - Infrastructure and Security Risk Management
 - Technology Inventory and Monitoring
 - Technical Audits
 - Software Replacement and Monitoring
 - Backup





Timeline

November 2014

GPO announced to the FDLP community its intent to seek certification for FDsys as a Trustworthy Digital Repository through and FDLP News Alert.

December 2014

- GPO initiated the process for seeking ISO 16363 certification and announced the project to the FDLP community through an FDLP News Alert and during the 2014 DLC Virtual Meeting.
- GPO was named by the Library of Congress and the National Institute of Museum and Library Services as one of the five institutions to receive a resident through the National Digital Stewardship Residency (NDSR) program. Under this program, GPO will host a resident for one year to work on a significant digital stewardship project. Specifically, GPO's NDSR resident will work on preparation for the audit and certification of FDsys as an ISO 16363 Trustworthy Digital Repository.

FY 2015

GPO prepares for the audit. Preparation includes: the identification and development of the necessary documentation and responses to the criteria by which FDsys will be evaluated and confirming accuracy of or adjusting to the business processes described in the documentation.

April 2016

NDSR Resident presented at Spring Virtual Conference on ISO 16363 Repository assessment process.

May 2016

GPO NDSR Resident preformed internal audit and completed compliance report.

August 2016

GPO publically released Request for Information to gather information from potential auditing bodies.

FY 2017

GPO plans to begin the acquisitions process for an external ISO 16363 certification audit.




Internal Audit Findings

- Internal compliance assessment process
 - Critical Not compliant (high priority)
 - Insufficient Needs some improvement (medium priority)
 - Fair Good enough (low priority)
 - Good Fully compliant
 - Excellent Exceptional compliance

 Of the three major areas of assessment within the ISO 16363:2012 Trustworthy Digital Repository standard, GPO has the most need for improvement in the area of Organizational Infrastructure.


