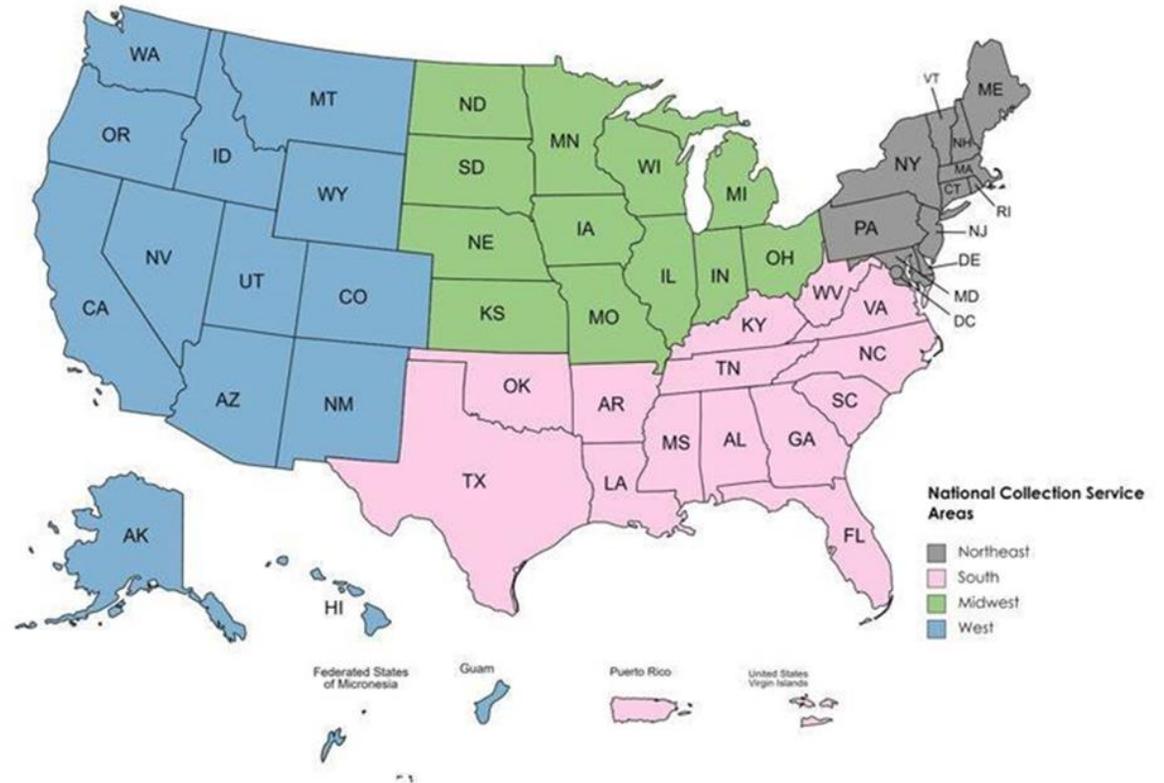





  - Individually harvested from agency website to Permanent and then ingested into GovInfo
- Complex Digital Objects (everything else)
  - Agency site harvests
  - Landing pages

# Digital Content Management

- Regularly reviewing continuing resources
- Investigating broken PURLs and resources no longer available
- Monthly PURLs validation reports
  - Manually evaluated 7000 PURLs in FY2026 so far
- Redirecting PURLs when agency websites change
  - National Laboratory of the Rockies changed domain to NLR.gov
  - 1700 PURLS redirected so far
- Special maintenance projects, such as reviewing all 200k+ PURLs targeting PDF files

# GPO Cataloging Guidelines: 505 Note

## 505 - Formatted Contents Note

- Do not include this field in original records. When copy cataloging, retain this field in OCLC but remove it for export to the CGP.
  - *Exception:* For multipart monographs, see [Bibliographic Cataloging: Monographs, 505 - Formatted Contents Note](#).
    - For congressional multipart, see [Bibliographic Cataloging: Congressional Publications, 505 - Formatted Contents Note](#).
  - *Exception:* For audiovisual resources, see [Bibliographic Cataloging: Audiovisual Resources, 5XX- Note Fields](#).

# GPO Cataloging Guidelines: Genre/Form

## Subject Cataloging: Library of Congress Genre/Form Terms for Library and Archival Materials (LCGFT)

- When an appropriate Library of Congress Genre/Form Term (LCGFT) exists, add it to a new or adapted bibliographic record at the time of cataloging.
- Continue adding appropriate \$v form subdivisions in LCSH fields as well.

# Current Status and Statistics

- LSCM continues to catalog Congressional Research Service (CRS) Reports in accordance with the agreement made in October 2018 with the Library of Congress
- To date, the GPO Metadata and Collection Services unit (MCS) has cataloged 12,055 CRS reports of the 13,594 reports published by the agency
- Approximately 90% cataloged

- 2023:
  - Began collaborating with the Congressional Research Service staff to generate a monthly spreadsheet of their newly published titles
- April 2023:
  - MCS Innovation Team developed automated processes to generate preliminary MARC records from the spreadsheets

# Milestones

- Collaborated with Office of Archival Management (OAM) to add PURLs to the preliminary records
- Preliminary records are saved to the OCLC Online Save File and assigned to our cataloging team
- June 2025:
  - CRS transferred all of their reports to Congress.gov
  - MCS worked with OAM to re-route all CRS report PURLs to Congress.gov via batch edit.

## Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Health Care: Recent Federal Activity

The role of artificial intelligence (AI) in health care has been of increased interest to recent federal administrations. Under the Biden Administration, AI in health care policy was generally characterized by a focus on risk mitigation. Under the second Trump Administration, the focus of AI in health care policy has generally shifted more toward rapid development and implementation of such tools.

Toward the close of the Biden Administration, E.O. 14110,

and distribution of new AI technology across every field, and dismantle unnecessary regulatory barriers that hinder the private sector in doing so.” The introduction then outlines three central pillars of the plan relating to (1) innovation, (2) infrastructure, and (3) international diplomacy and security. The *Plan* has implications for AI in health care, though AI in health care settings is infrequently referenced.

# Preservation Stewards and the CGP

- In February 2026, metadata representing over 47,700 rows of item-level entries from historic Preservation Steward inventories was ingested into the Catalog of U.S. Government Publications (CGP) as summary holdings and item records.
  - This was the result of over five years of effort, supported by all LSCM units, to establish an automated process to add this partnership metadata to the CGP.
  - Historic collections at the following Preservation Steward libraries were included in this test group of inventories:
    - Indiana University Maurer School of Law Jerome Hall Law Library
    - Middle Tennessee State University James E. Walker Library
    - University of Kansas Libraries
    - University of Minnesota Government Publications Library
    - University of North Texas Libraries
- Thank you to all our Preservation Stewards for their efforts to [submit historic inventories](#) – we will keep you posted on this continued effort as we ingest more metadata on these print retention collections into the CGP!

# Gap-filling Success for Historic Preservation Steward collections

- LSCM's Collection Management Librarian monitors offers in [FDLP eXchange](#) and through other channels and seeks to transfer good condition print volumes to historic Preservation Steward collections.
  - Gap-filling is optional under those Partnership agreements.
  - GPO provides a pre-paid shipping label to cover the costs of these shipments.
- 4,430 volumes were transferred to historic Preservation Steward collections in FY25.
- A few FY25 highlights:
  - 122 FRUS volumes to University of Virginia Shannon Library
  - 145 NLRB decisions to New Mexico State Library
  - 631 congressional hearings and prints to Utah State Merrill Cazier Library
  - 725 NOAA publications to University of Rhode Island Robert L. Carothers Library
  - 1,788 bound Serial Set volumes to IU Jerome Hall Law Library



# Digital Imaging Specifications

- Follow the Federal Agencies Digital Guidelines Initiative's [“Technical Guidelines for Digitizing Cultural Heritage Materials”](#) three-star level.
- Additional specifications include (exact specifications may differ based on the content being digitally imaged):
  - 400 ppi (original document size) with 24-bit RGB color.
  - Preservation file format: JPEG 2000 with up to a 20:1 lossless compression ratio.
  - Searchable and optimized PDFs compliant to the PDF/A2-b format specification standard.
  - OCR text saved as .txt file format for each publication.
  - Pages should have no visible skew (no more than between 0-1 degrees)
  - Pages cropped so the page edge is showing with a border of no less than 1/16 inch and no larger than 1/4 inch.

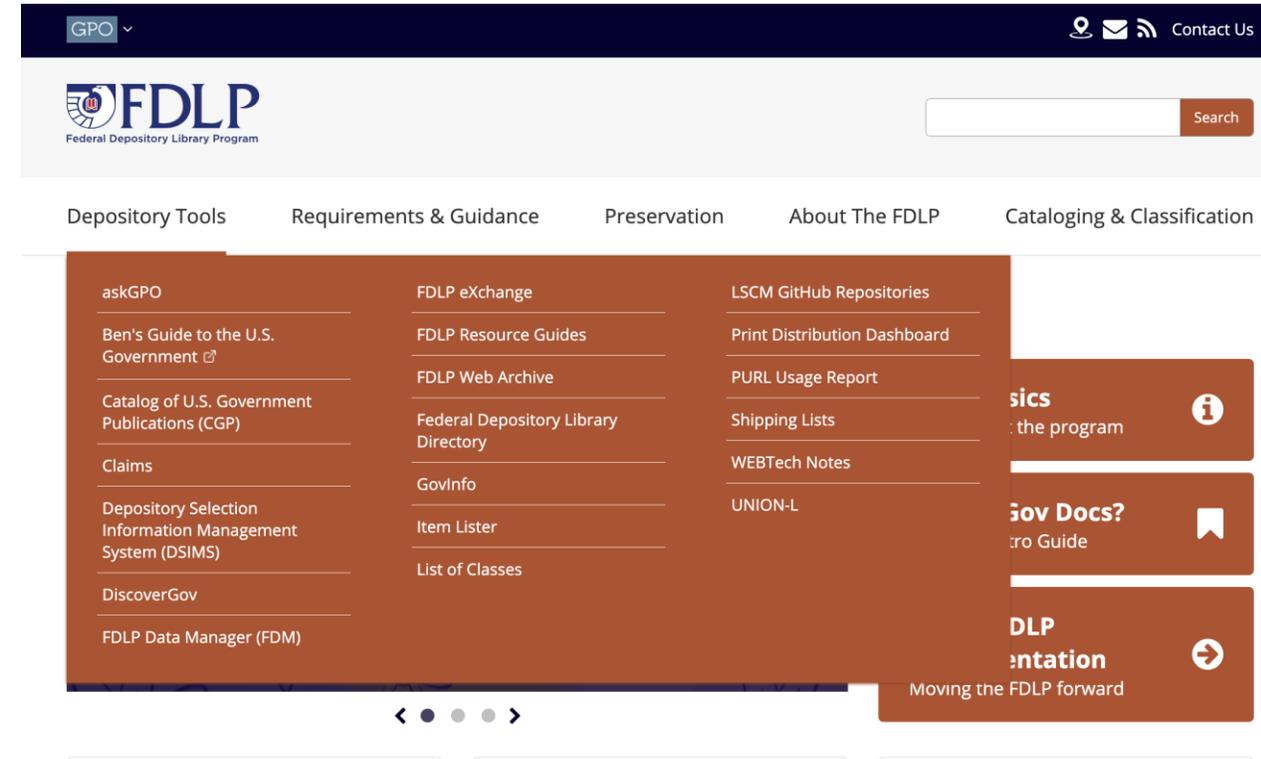

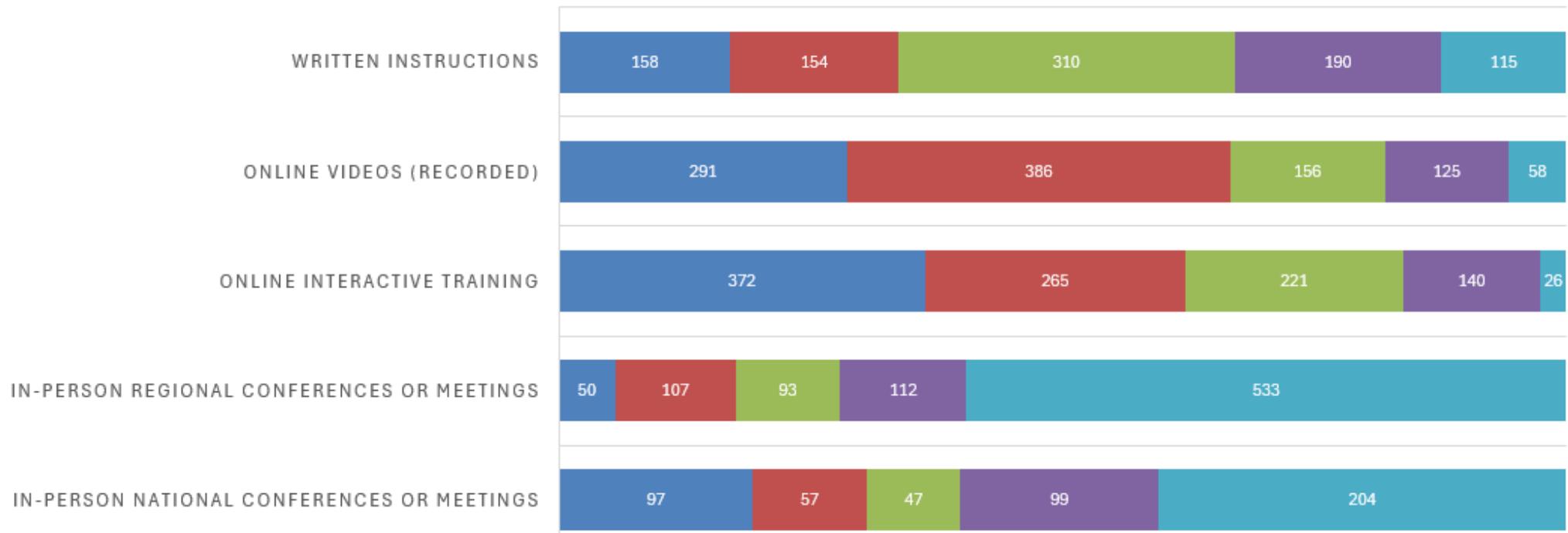

The Office of the Inspector General (OIG) conducted an inspection of GPO's Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) Assessments. We reported one finding with four recommendations intended to improve GPO's operation of the FDLP by updating current guidance and ensuring stakeholders approve changes considered necessary for the economical and practical implementation of the FDLP.

GPO reviewed the draft report and provided comments through the Director. In accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency standards for inspections, we reviewed GPO's comments for relevance and completeness and included them in their entirety in Appendix D. Our office is always open to alternatives to meet the intent of the recommendations as the Agency is the best arbiter of how recommendations should be implemented.

GPO concurred with all four recommendations, and its proposed actions were responsive to them. We summarize management's comments and provide a detailed response throughout the body of the report. All recommendations remain open.

# Finding 1

SuDoc is **not meeting** the intent of 44 U.S.C. §1909 to make “*firsthand investigation of conditions for which need is indicated*” with the Public Access Assessments of the Federal Depository Libraries.

- Multiple factors contribute:
  - Current SOD 312 policy is too restrictive
    - Firsthand investigations could be accomplished in a variety of ways
  - PAAs and previous incarnations were burdensome and overly complex
  - No communication from SuDoc to JCP about the cessation of PAAs

2. Update SOD 312 policy and create assessment rubrics, templates, and materials for evaluation.
3. Engage with the JCP as LSCM updates and implements recommendations as outlined #1 and #2.
4. Develop a recordkeeping system to track JCP requests and approvals.
