

## National Library of Medicine Databases: *NLM Gateway* and *NLM Databases and Electronic Resources*

Want to search all the databases of NLM with one search engine? The *NLM Gateway* lets you do this. There are help tools for searching by topics, authors, titles, and also for searching meeting abstracts. But there is only one search box. You use this online tool primarily for getting an idea of what NLM databases you should do further searches in after you've done a preliminary search.

Want a list of all of the databases of the NLM? *NLM Databases and Electronic Resources* lists them all in an A-Z file. Each listing contains an information file about the contents of the database, with a "Selected Resources" file highlighted on the right of the screen. At this presentation we've highlighted a number of databases, but some of those we haven't covered include these:

- AIDSInfo – results of AIDS clinical trials and federal AIDS guidelines
- Bioethics – ethical, legal, and policy issues in health care
- Cancer Information – from PubMed and National Cancer Institute
- Coffee Break – interactive tutorials
- DIRLINE – directory of health organizations
- Disaster Information – provision of health services after disasters
- Genetics Home Reference – genomics information for the public
- Household Products Database – safety information about household products
- LactMed – effects of drugs that breastfeeding mothers may be exposed to
- Online Exhibitions and Digital Projects - such as "Against the Odds: Making a Difference in Global Health"
- Profiles in Science – profiles of leaders in health research and public health
- Toxics Release Inventory (TRI) – data on the release of toxic chemicals
- Turning the Pages – digitized landmark books in the health sciences
- and more!
