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LibGuides

- ◆ User friendly subject and class/course guides
- ◆ Customized templates
- ◆ Easy to categorize and group information resources
- ◆ Integrate video slips, RSS Feeds, audio clips, etc.
- ◆ Easy to insert images
- ◆ Feedback column
- ◆ Interactive guides
- ◆ Useful to display hidden historic treasures from our collections – Special Collections from Govt. Docs.?



Blackboard

- ◆ Govt. Information available on “fingertips”
- ◆ Readily accessible via Blackboard
- ◆ Customized course content
- ◆ Easy to provide access to subject guide (LibGuide) by creating a link
- ◆ Easy to insert images and video clips
- ◆ Increases visibility of government documents collections and documents librarians online
- ◆ Useful for creating surveys and receiving feedback

Statistics and Tracking

- ◆ Easy to track usage both in LibGuides and Blackboard
- ◆ Apart from obtaining general statistics from the instruction database, these provide another option to track usage information by specific resources/websites/databases
- ◆ Number of hits per page/database/website
- ◆ Useful in writing semester end or yearly reports



Results

- ◆ Increases the visibility of government documents and librarians online
- ◆ Patrons like the guides as they are easy to navigate and use
