





### The National High School Debate Topics

- · Provides current and previous years' topics
- Selecting a topic offers:
  - Links to resources on GPO website
  - Links to other online federal agency resources and web sites on the topic
  - Links to other web sites on the current year's debate topic
  - Online reference tools including statistical compilations and searchable databases
  - Access to the online depository library directory to locate one nearby







#### Curriculum Links

  - In a few cases, there are multiple links that will be useful

# U.S. Government Information in Libraries

- http://www.gpoaccess.gov/libraries.html
- Select a state, area code, or specific Congressional District in a state
  - Provides a list of libraries in that category with their contact information
- Currently 13 federal depositories in Arkansas
  - Law schools and the Supreme Court Library have the smallest, most focused collections; make them the last option for referrals




