Country Information

Are you trying to find information on a particular country? Whether you are looking for a market to export your product, doing a report for school, or doing research for a planned vacation, there are lots of great government Internet sites to help.

General Country Overviews

The Central Intelligence Agency compiles the annual *CIA World Factbook* which contains brief profiles of selected countries. Each profile is updated annually and includes a color picture of the country flag and a map. There are even more detailed maps under the "Reference Maps" section. Click on the following to view the online version of this valuable resource:

The Department of State also compiles brief profiles of specific countries which are published as the *Background Notes* series. These profiles contain slightly more detailed information than what can be found in the *CIA World Factbook*; however, they are not updated on an annual basis. It is important to check the latest update date next to the country name to determine how current the information is. Click on the following link to view the country index by geographic regions. Then click on the appropriate region to view a list of available *Background Notes* and the date of publication. To view individual *Background Notes* click on the country name.

Can you help me find job openings listed on the internet?

Oklahoma's Job Bank lists current job openings throughout the state of Oklahoma and offers links to other job search sites on the world wide web.

<u>Can you help me find information on starting, financing, and running a small business?</u> There are several government web sites containing small business information. The <u>U.S. Business</u> <u>Advisor</u> is a gateway to some of this information. The <u>Small Business Administration</u> has information on <u>financing</u> and <u>starting</u> a small business, as well as information on <u>what gualifies a business as a small</u> <u>business</u>. They also sponsor the <u>Small Business Classroom</u> with interactive business guidance. The Internal Revenue Service has the <u>Small Business Corner</u> with helpful links for starting and operating a small business. OSHA has a <u>Small Business Resource</u> page with safety and health information specific to smaller employers.

Information specific to Oklahoma businesses can be obtained from the <u>Oklahoma Small Business</u> <u>Development Center</u>. They offer <u>workshops</u> to help in developing a small business and serve as an intermediary for the SBA's <u>Community Express loans</u>. For additional information, check the Oklahoma Secretary of State for <u>Business Registration Forms</u>, the Oklahoma Tax Commission's site for <u>Business Tax</u> <u>Forms</u> and the <u>Oklahoma District Office of the SBA</u>. The <u>Oklahoma Department of Commerce</u> also has state information on their site under <u>Developing Your Business</u>.

If you are starting a business in Tulsa be sure to check out the full-text version of <u>Doing Business in</u> <u>Tulsa</u> on the web and the <u>One-Stop Permit and Licensing Center</u>. The <u>Tulsa Metro Chamber</u> has a small business resource center for new and expanding businesses in the Tulsa area.

If you are starting a child care business then you will want to look at <u>Starting a Child Care Center in</u> <u>Oklahoma</u>. It is a planning guide from the Oklahoma Department of Human Services offering a step by step look at starting a child care business.

For further information the Oklahoma House of Representatives standing committee on Small Business has compiled a <u>Small Business Resource List and Selected Bibliography</u>. In addition, check out the <u>Business and Finance Online Research Center</u>.

American Indian Resource Center



The logo designed to represent the Tulsa City-County Library's American Indian Resource Center is a turtle surrounded by a circle. The turtle is a stylized representation of an engraved shell figurine pendant found at the Spiro Mounds archaeological site in Spiro, Oklahoma. (see <u>The Spiro Ceremonial Center</u>, James A. Brown. University of Michigan, Memoirs of the Museum of Anthropology, Number 29, 1996, p. 597). Artifacts found here show that prehistoric Spiro people created a sophisticated culture which influenced the entire Southeast.
