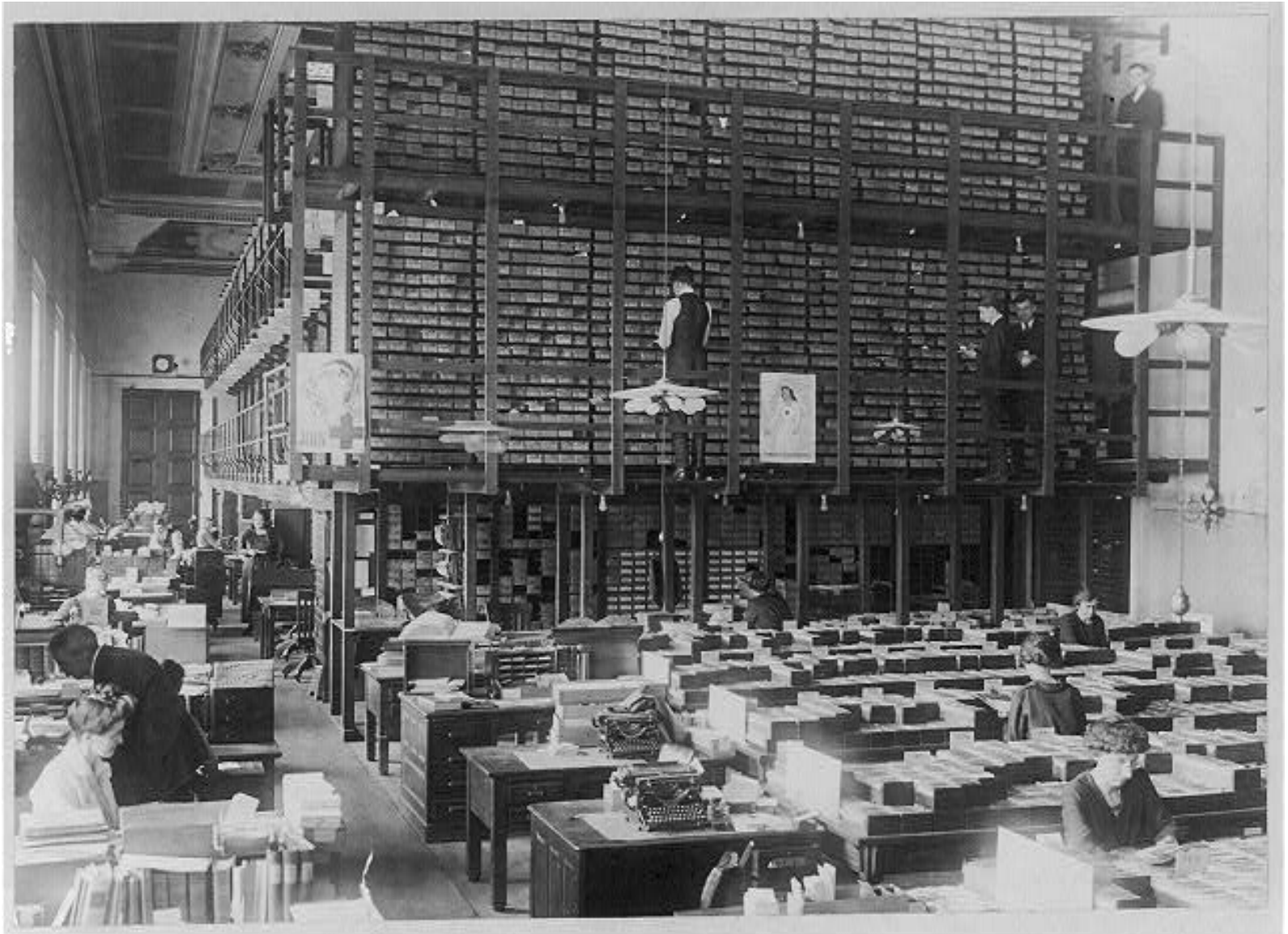


What CDS Does

- CDS develops and markets Library of Congress cataloging tools that ensure access to collections and resources.
- CDS operates under statutory authorization (2 USC 150)

CDS Statutory Authority: 2 USC 150 - 1902

“The Librarian of Congress is authorized to furnish to such institutions or individuals as may desire to buy them, such copies of the *card indexes and other publications* of the Library as may not be required for its ordinary transactions, and *charge for the same a price which will cover their costs and ten percentum added*, and all moneys received by him shall be deposited in the Treasury and shall be credited to the appropriation for necessary expenses for the *preparation and distribution* of catalog cards and other publications of the Library.”

 - Available for searching and individual MARC record downloading through LC online public access catalog at: <http://catalog.loc.gov> and <http://authorities.loc.gov>



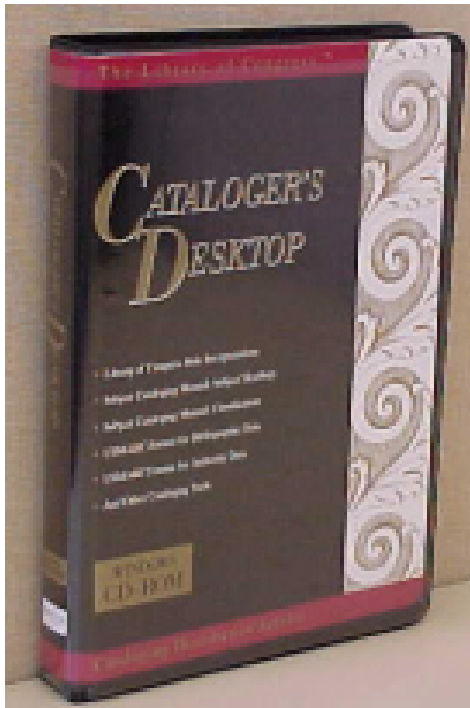
LC Subject Headings (depository)

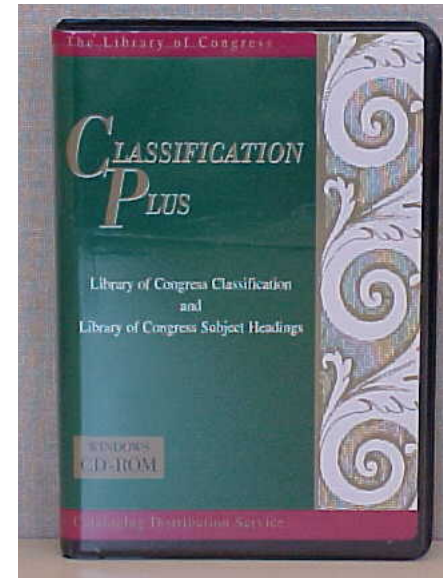

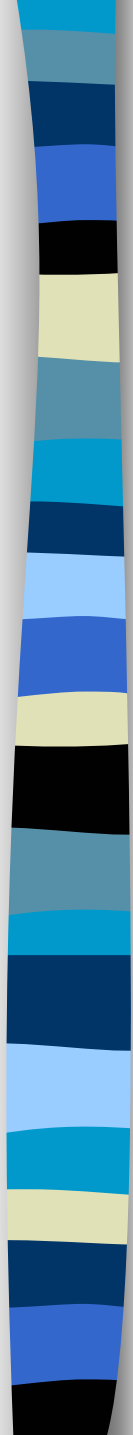




Web-Based Cataloging Tools

Classification Web

- January-August 2001: Pilot Test
- June 2002: Production Service
 - Fee-based subscription access
 - Integrated access to LC Classification & LC Subject Headings data
 - Non-depository because of licensed software





MARC 21 Documentation

- International standard formats for MARC (machine-readable cataloging)
- MARC 21 is the harmonization of USMARC and CAN/MARC formats
- MARC 21 publications available in paper format (depository) and on *Cataloger's Desktop*



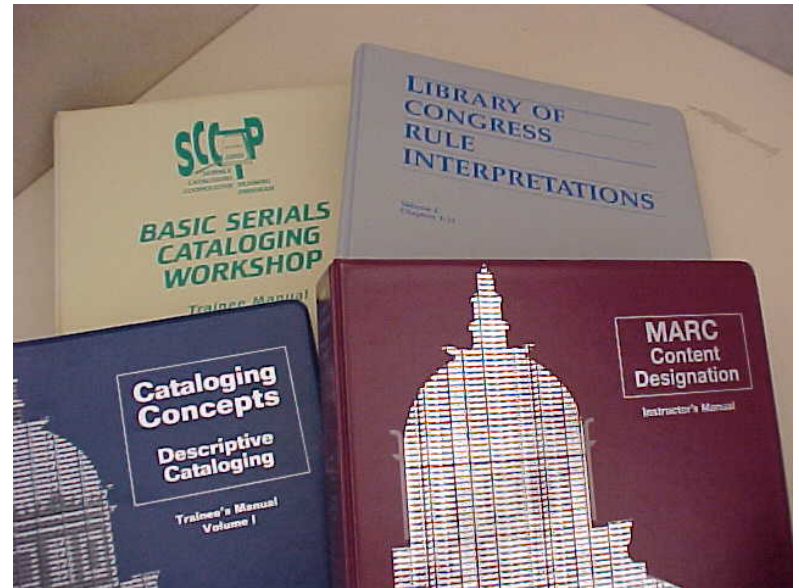

- *Cataloging Concepts: Descriptive Cataloging* (paper format; depository)
- *MARC Content Designation* (paper format; depository)
- SCCTP (Serials Cooperative Cataloging Training Program) manuals are fee-based PDF format. Non-depository because cooperatively produced and funded.
