Although the drama of one of the greatest maritime disasters -- the sinking of *R.M.S. Titanic* -- was played out over the course of just a few hours, the tragic event has captivated our imaginations for decades. What few remember, however, is that *Titanic* was more than the largest and most luxurious vessel of her time. She was also an "R.M.S.," a "Royal Mail Ship."

During *Titanic's* frantic final hours on April 15, 1912, *Titanic's* postal clerks, along with steward Albert Theissinger and several others, desperately tried to save the 200 sacks of registered mail by dragging them to the upper decks and possible safety. Theissinger was the only survivor to recall seeing the mail clerks alive. When he finally abandoned the seemingly suicidal task, the five mail clerks -- Americans [Oscar Scott Woody](#), [John Starr March](#), and [William Logan Gwinn](#) and British postal workers [James Bertram Williamson](#) and [John Richard Jago Smith](#)-- were still frantically at work, sloshing waist-
