Accounts are based on individuals. Usernames and passwords are determined by individual members.

The FDLP Desktop is transforming into the main informational hub for the FDLP by streamlining the dissemination of Program-related content. Keep informed through Web, RSS, and E-mail updates based on your preferences.

fdlp.gov relaunch

The FDLP Desktop is evolving in tandem with Web technologies and community feedback to enhance the services and mission of the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP). After a year of development and community involvement, GPO relaunched the FDLP Desktop in January 2009. The relaunch streamlines GPO's dissemination of Program-related news, content, and tools to enhance library participation and public services. It also migrates all social networking tools that were part of the beta Desktop to the FDLP Community site.

The FDLP Desktop serves as a centralized resource for the FDLP, which disseminates U.S. Government information to the American public through libraries across the nation. Through the Desktop, users can stay up-to-date with the latest innovations and progress of the Program, and Federal depository libraries can utilize various tools in order to enhance public services.

As Web technologies evolve, so too must GPO's dissemination techniques. As part of the relaunch, content has been updated and re-organized based on three services: Depository Administration, Collection Management and Outreach. Legacy Desktop content and tools are being evaluated for currency and effectiveness prior to migration to the new Desktop.

With the final release of the FDLP Desktop, the following tools are being deprecated in favor of more streamlined and Web appropriate technologies:

- Administrative Notes (AdNotes)
- FDLP Listservs (FDLP-L, FDL-Directors-L)

Information that was distributed via these tools will now be disseminated through the FDLP Desktop. As part of our streamlining, information will be published once and output in various formats:

- HTML (with options for PDF, print, and e-mail)
- RSS
- E-mail alerts

As content is migrated from the legacy Desktop, other tools may also become deprecated and new tools developed to take advantage of the latest technologies.

Content is the **first** & **foremost focus** of the Desktop.

- Blog about your professional thoughts and endeavors.
- Comment on blogs from fellow community members.
- Share expertise, problems, best practices, and more on the discussion forum.
- Create a member profile that includes contact information, subject specialization, professional memberships, personal biography, and avatar.
- Search for other members of the community that share your interests, affiliations, geographic proximity, library type, and more.
- Share photos in the gallery.
- Share, rate, and review Web sites.
- Share your library's and industry-related events in the calendar.
