In my cataloger's brain, I see this as: Disover.gov is a discovery layer that sits overtop various resources (like a one stop shop), since it sounds like Primo is what is being used. The CGP is an ILS (library catalog). Govinfo is another resource of many collections. So Discover.gov sits overtop these to search them all. (For example, we use Polaris as our ILS and Ebsco EDS as a discovery layer overtop so search the ILS and databases, etc. So that's how I understand this. And it would make sense to eventually replace Metalib
