Now that MARCIVE is going away, we plan to obtain MARC records for online items from OCLC's Worldshare. However, Our ILS (Evergreen) seems to require a barcode for online records. This is so that the system does not think the record is empty and delete it during the yearly purge. MARCIVE was attaching the barcode for us until now. For those of you who get records from OCLC, did you come across this problem and how do you automatically attach barcodes to your online records in the catalog?
