


OUR HISTORY

- Established in 1983 by Drs. Daniel F. Littlefield, Jr. and James W. Parins.
- Seed collections came from the University of Arizona Museum and UCLA.
- First collecting priority was Native-published newspapers and periodicals.
- First budget in FY2006




NEWSPAPER HIGHLIGHTS

First Native newspaper: Cherokee Phoenix, February 21, 1828

Oldest newspaper: Choctaw Telegraph, September 6, 1849

Longest continuous-running newspaper: Navajo Times

2800 titles in the collection representing 200 tribes in US and Canada











ALLECE LOCKE GARRARD


- Seminole-Choctaw drama teacher turned WWII Army hostess turned philanthropist





Winner of American Book Award and twice-nominated Pulitzer Prize author




MODERN WARRIORS OF WORLD WAR I


